(Carlisle Cannery) sold his Cohoe Net for \$75.00 and remitted the amount to the Custodian who credited it to KIMURA's account. He declared certain effects were left at Carlisle Cannery but the Manager there stated that although they knew of Japanese effects being left there, they were not tagged and could not be identified. Carlisle Cannery shipped the belongings of several Japanese persons to Vancouver but nothing belonging to KIMURA was included and it is assumed that his few effects could not be found.

We have received from Mr. Russell at Lethbridge Alberta, a letter enclosing Custodian Release Form in duplicate of which we send you one copy for your records. We are sending you this letter in duplicate in order that you may have a copy to send to Mr. Russell should you so wish.

We are quite ready to release these funds when we can determine the correct owner. In September we received from the manager of the Carlisle Cannery, \$75.00 for a Cohoe Net originally belonging to "K. Kimura". At that time the only man we could trace with such a name was a Mr. Kanji Kimura but on making further enquiries were informed by the Carlisle Cannery that the correct name was K. Eddie Kimura, sometimes known as Kenney Kimura. At that time the Carlisle Cannery sent us Mr. Kimura's letter to them asking for the money. This was signed "Kenney Kimura" and the signature is similar but by no means identical with that appearing on the enclosed application.

We have since then been making enquiries as to this man's identity and address. At one time we thought that he was living at Andrews House, Blackdale, Manitoba, and we sent him our "JP" forms for filling up. Subsequently from the copy of his letter sent us by the Carlisle Cannery, it appeared that he was living c/o Frank Bond, P. O. Box 15, Coaldale, Alta., and we have sent "JP" forms to him at that address.

We have a Kikuo Kimura, Registration No. 07428 formerly of Mission who declares himself to be a fisherman and logger, age 23, registered with us. This man may be the real owner of the net and the file we have opened for K. Eddie or Kenney Kimura may really cover Kikuo. This, however, we cannot know with certainty until we receive from Kenney Kimura the

"JP" forms sent to him at Coaldale duly filled up.

Finally, even if Kikuo Kimura should receive the \$75.00 in question, we have debts declared by him of \$165.00 to various persons, and \$135.00 to Dumaresq Brothers. We have also a debt of \$185.00 claimed against him by Mr. Yoshiichi Shin, so that in all probability, we cannot in any case send him any funds.

Thank you very much for your letter of February 5th. We are sorry to disappoint you, but as we have already told the Security Commission representative at Lethbridge, Alta., we cannot send you any money as we have the following claims against you:

2. Claimed by Yoshiichi SHIN--\$185.00

Please let us know if these amounts are correct and how you propose to pay them off.

We are still not quite satisfied with your identity. A Mr. Kikuo Kimura registered with us on April 17th, giving his age as twenty-three and his registration number as 07428. He declared no wife or children. On January 22nd on our request, you registered with us, but gave the same name as that of your wife and declared a child aged three years.

The signature on both these registrations was dissimilar, though one of them is similar to that given on the release form approved by Mr. Russell, applying for \$75.00. Still more important however, is the fact that neither of these signatures are at all similar to that of the Kenney Kimura appearing on the copy of a letter sent in August to Mr. Salter of the Carlisle Cannery, asking them whether the Coho net had been sold.

To sum up, we are not yet convinced of the correctness of your application for \$75.00 and even if we were, could not yet send you this money because of the claims set out above. We suggest you discuss this matter with Mr. Russell, to whom we have given most of this information on January 15th.

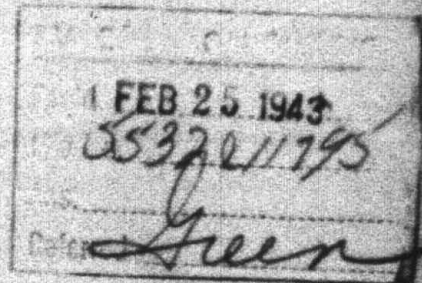

Yoshiichi SHIN filed a claim with the Custodian against Kikuo KIMURA in the amount of \$185.00.
