

This file reveals that KADONAGA owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

KADONAGA declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file. These were sold for the net sum of \$57.53 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian. Full details are given on summary and schedule on file.

Nets identified as belonging to KADONAGA were sold for the sum of \$359.00 and this sum credited to his account.

A cross cut saw identified as belonging to KADONAGA was sold for the sum of \$3.00 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian.

A Custodian cheque for \$418.74 was remitted to KADONAGA on May 2/45, being his entire balance at that time. There remains a credit of \$.79 in his account and this is now being remitted to him.

SPECIFIED
ARTICLES:

The fishing vessel declared by KADONAGA was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$344.00 and this sum paid to him on Sept. 3/42. Full details are given on Specified Articles Summary on file.

WAR SAVINGS
CERTIFICATES:

He declared one \$5.00 War Savings Certificate in the name of his daughter Tsuneko. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

KADONAGA made his declaration to the Custodian on April 17/42 and was evacuated on April 26/42. He declared chattels as shown on the Chattel Schedule on file at the Imperial Cannery. (He actually worked at the Celtic Cannery at the foot of Blenheim St., Vancouver, and lived in one of their houses. However the Celtic Cannery is owned by the Imperial, so that may account for his statement that his chattels were at the Imperial Cannery).

Chattels were inventoried by the Custodian in the name of KADONAGA at the school house of the Celtic Cannery. (This was used as a storehouse for Japanese goods). Chattels were sold as shown on Chattel Schedule for the net sum of \$57.53 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian.

The kitchen stove and heater stove not inventoried by the Custodian may have been left at the Cannery house at the request of the Cannery or may not have been of sufficient value to move. However as the inventory was not taken until July 4, 1944, it is possible that some goods may have been stolen before the inventory was taken. One bed and one sewing machine were not found by the Custodian. We did inventory 4 boxes which may have contained the kitchen utensils and chinaware declared, but the four boxes are missing. The 2 mirrors declared and inventoried are also missing.

It is noted however that the following goods not declared by KADONAGA but inventoried in his name, were sold and the proceeds credited to his account:

2 dressers with mirrors
1 china cabinet

1 water tank
garden hose and misc. garden tools

As practically all chattels of those living at the Celtic Cannery were stored in this schoolhouse it is quite likely that these goods belonged to someone else. However the money from their sale has already been remitted to KADONAGA, so there is nothing we can do about this error now.

When the chattels were checked at Steveston in Oct. 1945, 3 cartons were found and identified as belonging to KADONAGA. One carton contained a shrine, a musical instrument and a Japanese doll in case. The first two articles were kept in storage as personal goods and the doll or dolls sold at auction on Nov. 9/45 for the net sum of \$.79. This is his only credit balance with the Custodian at this time. This amount is included in the total proceeds from chattels mentioned in paragraph 2.

One carton contained blankets and these were given to U.N.R.R.A. It also contained some old kapoc and this was discarded. The third carton contained curtains, 3 blankets and 8 cushions and these were given to U.N.R.R.A. It also contained some old clothing which was discarded.

KADONAGA declared 8 fishing nets. Nets indentified as belonging to him were found at the Celtic Cannery and sold for the sum of \$359.00. There is one net which he describes as 10/40x9 1/2 x 30 - 85 F. which we did not find. We wrote and advised him that this could not be found in our letter of May 2/45.


A cross cut saw identified as belonging to KADONAGA was sold for the sum of \$3.00 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian.

On May 2/45 we remitted him a cheque for \$418.74. This was his total balance at that time. A_g stated previously the only sum now standing to his credit is from the sale of Japanese dolls in Nov. 1945.

All trunks and personal belongings in storage at Steveston were opened and inspected in October, 1945. Goods of no value were discarded; clothing of no saleable value were turned over to U.N.R.R.A.; saleable articles were auctioned and any personal photographs or goods of a personal nature are stored at the Buddhist Temple at Steveston ready for shipment at the request of the Japanese. Our agent, Mr. Howe, states that he visited our storeroom in Nov./46 and found that the building had been ransacked and the goods in storage so badly mixed that it would now be impossible to positively identify any of the goods.

Dear Sir:-

As requested by the B. C. Security Commission in their letter of April 21st, we are enclosing our cheque for \$418.74. This exhausts your credit with this office. It is composed of proceeds of sales of fishing equipment (\$359.00) plus proceeds of auction sales as per our enclosures (\$56.74) and the sale of a cross-cut saw (\$9.00) made at Steveston prior to date of commencement of our auction sales.

Turning to your 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " net said to be left at the Imperial Cannery, we regret that we have no record of this. You lived near the Celtic Cannery and all your nets were left stored there. When you registered you only declared eight fishing nets without giving particulars of the size and mesh.

Another Japanese, Tetsu Kadonaga, lived in the same locality and is probably a relative of yours. He did declare a 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " mesh net. An untagged net of these dimensions was found in the Celtic Cannery and has been credited to Tetsu's account. Perhaps you would like to advise us what your relationship with Tetsu was and whether perhaps you to some extent duplicated your declarations of fishing equipment.
