Tatsuichi YONEDA died on September 1, 1942, in Vancouver. He was survived by his widow, Haruko, file 7100; three sons, Kazuo, file 4407; Yusuke, Enemy file 1311, in Japan, Kazuo, file 4407, and Minoru, a minor; and three daughters, Kimiye, Enemy file 1310 in Japan, Fumi, file 7116, and Hiroko, a minor.

The administration of the estate of Tatsuichi YONEDA, which consisted only of the Personal Property as shown on the Personal Property Summary on file, was undertaken by A. G. Freeze, the Official Administrator at Cumberland, B. C. According to his statement of Receipts and Disbursements on file, the residue of the estate after payment of all claims and expenses, was \$135.41. These funds were remitted to this office with instructions that the widow was to receive one-third and each child one-ninth of this amount. The sum of \$45.14 was, accordingly forwarded to Mrs. Yoneda for her personal use and the shares of Fumiye, Hiroko and Minoru in the sum of \$15.04 each were forwarded to her "In Trust". The share of the son, Kazuo, in the amount of \$15.04 was sent to him direct and the shares of Kimiye and Yusuke are held in Enemy accounts in their names in this office.

Claims filed against the deceased were referred to the Administrator as shown on Liabilities Summary on file.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 5553

Re: Mr. Tatsuichi YONEDA (Deceased) Reg. No. 06495

On April 18th, 1942, this man signed a declaration to the Custodian reporting his property. He died in Vancouver on September 1st, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a quantity of chattels left at Cumberland Storage and Sales. Shipments were made to him on June 9th, 1942, July 22nd, 1942, and a shipment was made to Mrs. YONEDA on October 30th, 1942. Altogether, eleven pieces were shipped of the goods that this man had left at Courtenay. On November 3rd, 1942, Mr. Matt Brown, Custodian Agent, supplied this office and the Official Administrator with a list of the articles still in storage. These are shown on the Chattel Schedule. In addition to the goods in Cumberland Storage in November, 1942, a sewing machine, a large electric iron, and two large mirrors were in the care of the Red Cross, Courtenay Branch. As information regarding all these goods was sent to Mr. Freeze, Official Administrator, Courtenay, B. C., it is assumed that he took all these goods under his administration and that these were included in the estate of the deceased.

Mr. YONEDA reported having two \$100.00 Victory Bonds, one \$50.00 Victory Bond, and nine \$5.00 War Savings Certificates in his possession at the time of his declaration. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian. He reported a bank account at Courtenay of \$300.00. On April 28th, 1943, as shown by the Statement of Receipts and Disbursements, the sum of \$178.38 was in the Royal Bank of Canada, Courtenay, and was included in the estate of this man.

On February 15th, 1943, we wrote to Mrs. Haruko YONEDA, widow of the deceased, in regard to a claim filed by Mr. Fred Frank Coleman, 914 West Pender Street, in regard to some clothing which he stated he had left in the care of Mrs. YONEDA. On February 20th, 1943, Mrs. YONEDA, explained that the clothing had not been delivered because Mr. Coleman had not paid for it. This information was passed on to Mr. Coleman and nothing further appears on the file in regard to this matter.

The information from the R.C.M.P. states that YONEDA was the owner of a Studebaker car. Our records do not show that a car belonging to this man was surrendered. No motor vehicle of any kind registered in the name of Tatsuichi YONEDA came under the control of the Custodian.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

It would appear that the shipments made by Mr. Matt Brown prior to November 3, 1942, took care of the first six items on the list of goods declared.

The cash register was not listed in Mr. Freeze's letter of December 7, 1944, but this may have been an oversight, and this article may have been taken over by Mr. Freeze, when following the death of Mr. Tatsuichi YONEDA, his property passed from the control of the Custodian to that of the Official Administrator, as it was later sold by him, as was the iron and at least one mirror.

No action was taken by the Custodian in regard to these two claims and it would seem that neither claim was filed with the Official Administrator. It would appear, therefore, that the deceased was not the debtor concerned in these two claims.

The Statement of Receipts and Disbursements in connection with the estate of the deceased is filed under date of July 13th, 1945. This shows payments made by the Official Administrator in respect to claims against the estate.

With reference to your letter to me of Sept. 16th your file 6637, and my reply of October 5th, re Estate of Imaji Kushida (Widow Mrs Toxo (Patsu) Yoshida) to which I have had no reply.

A very similar case, that of Tatsuichi Yoneda Reg. #06405 now deceased, has been referred to me, but before taking any action towards taking out letters of administration, I would like to know the attitude of the Custodian in matters coming under the Provincial "Administration Act". Mr Yoneda was naturalized on June 10th 1914, and presumably his widow is a British Subject, but I am advised that there may be children of the deceased in Japan who would be Japanese nationals, and entitled to share in the estate. His Widow, Haruko Yoneda of Minto City, Bridge River district, advised that she was advised by the Custodian to get in touch with some one in Courtenay to act on her behalf in the matter of the estate and particularly in the matter of a bank account of \$176.40 which she desires sent to her after paying for expenses. I am also advised that there is in the estate two \$100.00 Victory Bonds, one \$50.00 Victory Bond, and nine \$5.00 War Savings Certificates, but who has possession of these is not disclosed. Would you advise if the Custodian has these in his possession..

The B. C. Security Commission paid funeral expenses of \$50.00, Doctor's bills of \$100.00 and Hospital bills of \$59.00 which they hope to recover from the estate.

I would be pleased to hear from you as to the attitude of the Custodian in the matter, and matters of a similar nature.

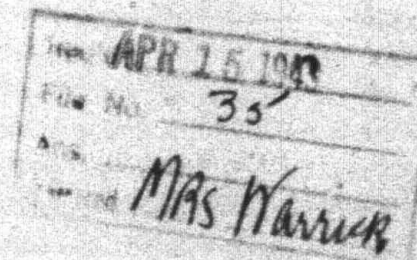

The Estate is being administered by Arthur

The deceased left his whole Estate, \$935.40,
to Haruko Yoneda (Wife), Kazuo Yoneda (Son), Fumi

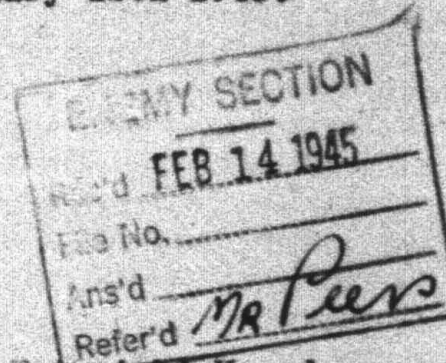

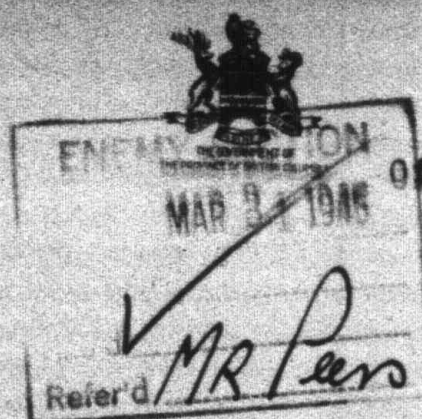

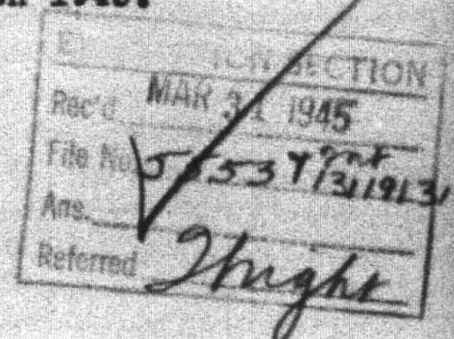
