Re: HIRAKIDA, Hakino (Mrs.) 455 Keefer St., Vancouver, B.C. File: 56189.

The above-named has been in receipt of old-age pension at the rate of \$40.00 per month since February 1st, 1950. According to our file she is residing at 455 Keefer St. and her date of birth appears on our application as December 29, 1879.

When Mrs. Hirakida submitted her application she stated that she had resided in British Columbia continuously from March 1927 to September 1946. From September 1946 until July 1949 she was living in Saskatchewan at which time she returned to Vancouver, B.C.

It is noted that this pensioner did not go to Saskatchewan until several months after the end of the War. In view of this we are wondering if this Japanese would be considered as an evacuated Japanese who was moved to another province as a temporary resident under arrangements and agreements between the Federal Government and the Provincial? In other words, did this pensioner go to Saskatchewan under exactly the same arrangements as those who were actually evacuated during the War? Could you also please let us know by whom her fare was paid?
