Deer Stret-I have been asked by two elderly Japanese evacuees:-Riyo Rabibara, Ripp, Alta. (Midos) Lehijiro Matamabo, Kipp, Alta. (Bachelor) if your Department can give some financial assistance for their return to Japan. Both of the above parties were evacuated from Abbotsford, B.C. in 1942 and have since been of the farm of Mr. Hans Ellingson, Mpp. Alta. Mrs. Rivo Ishihara whose husband cassed away last fall is orippled in the left leg and right hand and has no relatives in this country to depend upon for subsistence. She is presently living on a farm and is living on a meager relief she obtains from the Felfare Department. She fours that unless she returns to Japan to her saletimes, she may become totally disabled and become a patient in a Government institution. Friends and neighbours have helped but the damnot always depend upon their assistance. Mr. Watenabe lives next door to Mrs. Ishihara and he was in partnership on beet labour contract with Mr. Ishihara until his in the summer, other than this he has no income. From his manger to seem to his been helping firs. I shifters. He wishes to return to depen to his relatives because at his new contracts. on death last fall. He does some best Labour and odd farm jobs n to his relatives because at his age of 66 he cannot make a living. and also to accompany Mrs. Ishihara as she cannot travel alone in her semi-invalid condition. He too has no relatives in this country. I sincerely hope that your Department can give these alderly persons some kind of help - say a fare back to Japan. If they must pay their own fare they will have to spend most, if not all of their some assets for fare alone. If they stay in Canada they will become permanent burden to the Canadian Government, and this would mean far greater expense to the Government. I would appreciate your reply as soon as possible.
