The above, who registered with the Custodian on April 23/42, and was evacuated on April 28/42, stated that she owned no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area of British Columbia. Nevertheless, a complete bed and spring, marked with the name of the above, was removed from the Catholic Mission at Steveston on January 18/44 by the Custodian, and sold at Steveston auction No. 5 on Feb. 4/44 for the net sum of \$13.44, and this sum was credited to her account with this office.

The file reveals that Miss MISUYABU had a sewing machine stored at Crone Storage Ltd. She wrote to this firm on April 20/43 asking them to ship the machine to her at Greenwood. We gave our permission to the company in our letter of April 30/43, to ship this machine and presume that this was done.

The file reveals that the above owned no specified articles.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.
