-This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 22, 1942, in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

However this man requested that clothes left at his former place of residence be forwarded to him. These clothes were included in chattels reported by his nephew, File No. 1404. This file does not show if these clothes were shipped.

Sajiro WAKITA filed a claim against this man for \$6.00. This was referred to SHIN but we received no reply. We have no funds to his credit, creditor so advised.

This file reveals no other liabilities of any kind.


Re: Jiromatsu SHIN, Ser. No. 10211.

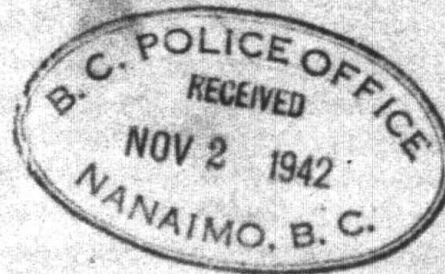

The party named in this letter, bears the same christian name as that of a party who lived at 1228 Stewart Avenue but the surname and the registration number is different from the one entered in the J. P. Form sent me. However, there appears to be some connection, considering the fact that the street number is the same.

¹⁴⁰⁴ I might state that we have considerable effects in storage for Masajiro Shin, registration #07859, and if this could be one of the same family, we have as stated, considerable clothing and other effects.

Some time ago you advised me not to make any further shipments until advised, and under these conditions, I am not free to make any shipments to this or any other party, without further instructions from you.

Please advise in reference to this.

Re: SHIN, Jiroemon & the Shin Family

Thank you for your letter of November 14th which we are answering in duplicate so that you may hand a copy to the police at your end. We are also sending a copy direct to the Assistant Supervisor at Sendon.

Jiroemon Shin, Registration No. 10211, age 70 years, lived at 1228 Stewart Avenue and declared no property of any kind whatsoever on April 23rd.

Masajiro Shin, Registration No. 07899, age 44 years, presumably brother of the above, declared ownership of lots 1, 2, and 3 in Newcastle Terrace, etc. etc., being 1228 Stewart Avenue and three dwelling houses thereon registered in the names of his three sons. This case was assigned to you and you reported on it at the beginning of June, sending us also an inventory which you had moved to the Japanese Community Hall. This man also declared no personal property left in Vancouver and you commented on this in your report.

Finally, Masaharu Shin, Registration No. 06583, age 39, being the son of the foregoing, declared furniture and household effects at 1228 Stewart Avenue, Vancouver, being obviously those given in your report under the father.

On October 5th we referred the inventory taken by you to both father and son and it was returned signed by the son as comprising all his chattels left in British Columbia.

It now seems clear that some of those chattels belong to Jiroemon Shin, being probably those mentioned under "Personal Effects and Utensils" as follows.

Messrs. E. W. Forward & Son, our
Hananimo agents, have sent us your letter of Oct-
ober 27th to the Chief of Police at Hananimo. We
enclose copy of our reply which we think is self-
explanatory and only calls for the following com-
ments.

(1) Please give us some way of ident-
ifying the clothing belonging to Jiromatsu Shin
which is obviously included with that signed for by
Masaharu Shin.

(2) For reasons we need not go into
here, Mr. Fisher has stopped all shipments from
Hananimo and we shall have to refer to him before
having anything sent. In view of the exceptional
circumstances we have no doubt we can arrange this.
