



This is further to your telegram of May 29th, saying that you would accept the Phoenix Cannery's offer of \$125.00 for your 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ net with lines, but asking us to make a better deal if possible. We are glad to say that the Phoenix Cannery have been able to sell this net for \$130.00, and we are holding their cheque for this amount, in your name.

On further enquiry on the Phoenix Cannery, we find that this net belongs to your brother, Saichi Tamoto. While Mr. Lord tells us that he is sure it will be alright to pay you this money, we must first get your brother's authority. We understand his address is at Three Valley Camp, and we are writing to him to ask if this money may be paid to you. We suggest you also write to him and give him details of the transaction.

You will see from attached correspondence that an error has arisen in connection with the sale of a net. This was due to the fact that Mr. Lord of the Phoenix Cannery could only give me the initial of the Japanese owner of the net. I referred the offer to the sister in error and sold the net on her authority. It was not until I was about to send the cheque off that I noticed that the supposed owner was a lady and I then referred the matter to Mr. Lord. He can still not tell me what name "S." stands for, but felt confident that I would not go wrong in sending the money to the sister. However, as you will see, I have written to the brother (presumed--both living at the same address and c/o the Phoenix Cannery) and asked what he wishes us to do.
