1. I am Manager of the Bank of Montreal, New Westminster Branch, and as such have full knowledge of the matters herein deposed to.
2. That Paragon Service Station, T. Tsuji, of Third and Main Streets, in the City of Vancouver, British Columbia, and Tetsuo Aoki, of Woodfibre, British Columbia, are jointly and severally indebted to the Bank of Montreal in the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, under and pursuant to a certain promissory note dated at New Westminster, British Columbia, February 14th, 1942 for \$50.00 payable sixty (60) days after date and made by the said Paragon Service Station and T. Tsuji in favour of Tetsuo Aoki and endorsed by the said Tetsuo Aoki to the Bank of Montreal, said note being payable at the Royal Bank of Canada Mount Pleasant Branch, Vancouver, British Columbia, without interest.
3. That the said Bank of Montreal holds no security for payment of the said note except as the holder of the said promissory note for value.
