


One was owing by him to the Pacific Co-operative Union for \$21.79 and this sum was deducted from proceeds of sale of the truck made through them.


It is noted on the Pacific Co-operative Union statements that when remitting truck proceeds they had credited to this account 80¢ being interest on a United Farmers Co-operative Share. This was actually interest on his father's share with the Co-operative.

INVESTMENTS & BONDS: The above Japanese declared a \$5.00 War Savings Certificate in his possession. This was not brought under control by the Custodian.

We have to acknowledge your letter of August 3, returning Custodian cheque for \$3.90 in favour of your late father, for which we thank you. Our official receipt is attached.

We note from the Memorandum of Particulars form which you were good enough to complete that you paid funeral expenses in the sum of \$159.90. We are, therefore, enclosing Custodian cheque in your favour in the sum of \$3.90, being the balance of funds to the credit of the account of your late father in this office, to partially re-imbure you for your outlay.

The forty-five unredeemable Pacific Co-operative Union Shares belonging to your father have no redemption value at this time but will continue to draw interest at the rate of 1% per annum. As these funds accrue they will be sent to you to apply on the funeral expenses and if at some future date these shares are redeemed, you will be advised.

Dear Sir:

Your file has come under review and we take this opportunity of giving you a brief summary of our administration of your affairs.

When registering with the Custodian you made a declaration to the effect that the only assets owned by you in the Protected Area were a War Savings Certificate which was not brought under control by the Custodian, and a 1937 Ford truck.

Your truck having been transferred by you to the Pacific Co-operative Union for sale prior to your registration with this office, was released to them. The Pacific Co-operative Union sold the truck for the sum of \$400.00, and remitted this sum to this office, less \$21.79 which was your debit balance according to their records. On their statement when remitting these funds, it is noted that interest on a United Farmers' Co-operative Union share in the amount of 80¢ was also included and credited to your account. This share was actually your father's, and the interest therefore should have been credited to him. However, as all your funds have been remitted to you, we are leaving the adjustment of this to be made between yourselves.

The Pacific Co-operative Union filed a claim in the amount of \$44.30 against you covering repairs to your truck. This matter had been overlooked by them owing to an error in posting to their ledgers. It was referred to you and in accordance with a letter received from you and your father on the 12th December, 1943, settlement of this claim was made from your father's account.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

Replying to your letter of July 5th, 1943 dealing with the claim against you by the Pacific Co-Operative Union of \$44.30 which represents a repair bill submitted by the Pacific Co-Operative Union from the Routledge Motors Ltd., Mission.

We find on investigation, while the repairs were carried out subsequent to the time you handed the truck over to the Pacific Co-Operative Union, they were done prior to the truck being put into use by the Co-Operative, and they were found to be necessary in order that the truck could be used to the best advantage. Under the circumstances we consider this is a claim which should be paid by you and we would appreciate your authorizing us to do so.

If the claim is to be paid from your father's account please have him sign the authorization as requested in this office letter to you dated the 16th of June, 1943 and signed by Mr. R. P. Alexander.

Dear Sir:

In response to the request contained in your letter dated June 7th, we are sending to you attached our cheque No. 3705 payable to your order and amounting to \$100.00, the receipt of which please acknowledge by return mail. Your remaining credit balance with the Custodian stands at \$179.10, and in accordance with your wishes you may anticipate receiving further remittances in July and August.

Today's mail brought us a letter from the Pacific Co-operative Union advising us that they have just charged your account with the sum of \$44.30. Your account, therefore, with the Pacific Co-operative Union shows a debit balance of \$44.30, and they have asked us to send them a cheque for this amount. In support of the claim made by the Pacific Co-operative Union against you, they tell us that this charge of \$44.30 covers a repair bill dated May 29th, 1942, from the Routledge Motors Ltd., Mission, the items making up said repairs being as follows:

With reference to your letter of the 16th instant in which you enquire regarding your Ford Light Delivery Truck left with the Pacific Co-Operative Union.

We have recently been enquiring into the matter with the Pacific Co-Operative Union and find that trucks have in some cases been rented and others sold on the basis of payment according to tonnage hauled.

The whole situation was not very satisfactory and we are now in process of having this matter adjusted and it is anticipated that a settlement will be made on the basis of a straight sale to the Pacific Co-Operative Union, the trucks having been properly valued.

We expect therefore that in due course we will be in a position to advise you of the final disposition of your truck and the arrangements made for payment of same.
