1 Two storey frame dwelling, 1 woodshed, 1 bath house, 1 Three room shack 18' x 40', 1 shack 12' x 20', 1 barn. Condition of buildings - House - good, all others fair.

HISTORY OF ADMINISTRATION: This property was leased by Masatsugu HARAGA to Fred L. Hunter, April 14th, 1942, for the term of 10 months, from April 1st, 1942, with option to extend lease for 1943, arrangements to be made with Pacific Co-Operative Union. Consideration being \$250.00 and fertiliser account with Pacific Co-Operative Union amounting to approximately \$66.75. HARAGA reports on his JP Form that he received \$125.00 cash and there was placed to his credit on January 18th, 1943, the sum of \$126.20 by the Pacific Co-Operative Union, being balance owing by Hunter from the 1942 crop. This lease was extended by Collateral Agreement to October 31st, 1943, for the sum of \$75.00, payable August 31st, 1943. Lease and Collateral Agreement were handed to the S.S.B. July 23rd, 1943, and the consideration for the 1943 extension, vis., \$75.00, was paid by cheque to the Veterans' Land Act, November 17th, 1943.

SOLD: To The Director, The Veterans' Land Act for \$1223.00 as at January 1st, 1943.
Approval of Advisory Committee - 1st June, 1943.
Mr. John MacRitchie gave a Deed dated May 13th, 1944 to Masatsugu HARAGA, conveying the property purchased by Masatsugu HARAGA on

12th January, 1931, under Agreement for Sale - North West $\frac{1}{4}$ of South East $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14, Township 13, Municipality of Matequi, D. N. W. This conveyance was registered in the Land Registry Office, New Westminster, May 16th, 1944. Cheque covering the balance owing, viz., Principal - \$797.57 and Interest - $\frac{115.70}{\$913.27}$

was issued to Mr. John MacRitchie, June 28th, 1944.


Funds released to the credit of Masatsugu HARAGA - June 28th, 1944. Net amount after payment of balance of Agreement for Sale and Interest - \$913.27, Registration Fee - \$3.00, Legal Fees - \$15.00, leaving a net credit of \$292.73 from said transaction.

Adjustments re Tax Arrears to December 31st, 1942, amounting to \$35.49 were charged to Masatsugu HARAGA'S account.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT Made the Twelfth day of January in the
year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one
BETWEEN

JOHN MacRITCHIE, 604 12th Avenue West, Vancouver,
British Columbia, Blacksmith,
(who and whose heirs, executors, administrators and assigns or successors and
assigns are hereinafter included in the word "Vendor" and are hereinafter
called the "Vendor")
of the One Part;

AND
MASATSUGU HARAGA, R.R. No. 1 Abbotsford, British
Columbia, Rancher,
(who and whose heirs, executors, administrators and assigns or successors
and assigns are hereinafter included in the word "Purchaser," and are
hereinafter called the "Purchaser")
of the Other Part;

WITNESSETH; WHEREAS the Vendor has agreed to sell to the purchaser and the
purchaser has agreed to purchase of and from the vendor the lands, hereditaments
and premises hereinafter described, that is to say: ALL and Singular that
certain parcel or tract of Land and premises, situate and being in the
Municipality of Matsqui in the Province of British Columbia, and known and
described as North West Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section Fourteen
(14) Township Thirteen (13) in the District of New Westminster.

TOGETHER with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging at or for
the price or sum of Fourteen hundred and fifty (\$1450.00) Dollars of lawful
money of Canada, payable in manner and on the days and times hereinafter
mentioned, that is to say; the sum of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars on or
before the execution of this Agreement (the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged), and the balance as follows: Three hundred (\$300.00) Dollars
on the 1st day of May, 1931. Two hundred (\$200.00) dollars on the 15th day
of September, 1932, and Two hundred (\$200.00) dollars yearly thereafter on the
15th day of September in each and every year consecutively until the whole
amount of said purchase price is paid in full without any deduction or abatement
whatsoever, and interest as hereinafter mentioned. The purchaser doth hereby
covenant, promise and agree to and with the vendor that the purchaser will pay
the sums of money above mentioned on the days and times above mentioned, and
will further pay interest on all moneys from time to time owing hereunder by
payments on the same dates as principal in each and every year at the rate of

Six per cent. per annum as well after as before maturity, arrears of both principal and interest to bear interest at the rate aforesaid, such interest on arrears to be a charge on the land in the same manner as all moneys hereby secured, said interest to be calculated on the amount of principal outstanding at the commencement of each interest period.

PROVIDED ALWAYS that the purchaser may at any time prepay the whole or any part of the purchase money with interest thereon up to the end of the then current interest period; that the purchaser will well and truly pay to the vendor or his agent the said sums of money above mentioned, with interest as above provided, at the office of Hugh M. Fraser & Co., Limited, in the city of Vancouver, in the Province aforesaid; and the receipt given by Hugh M. Fraser & Co., Limited, for such payment or payments shall be a valid receipt on account of this agreement.

That the purchaser will pay and discharge when due, all taxes, rates and assessments wherewith the said land may be rated or charged from and after 1 Jan. 1931. That the purchaser will pay when due the premium or premiums necessary to keep the buildings insured to the amount of their full insurable value in a company selected by the vendor and deliver such policy or policies to the vendor, having loss payable to the vendor as the vendor's interest may appear. And should the purchaser fail or neglect to carry out the aforesaid covenant the vendor may pay such taxes, rates, assessments or insurance premium, or any of them, and such sum or sums so paid shall be a lien and charge on the said lands in favor of the vendor and bear interest at the rate aforesaid, and be payable on demand of the vendor.

AND the vendor hereby covenants to and with the purchaser that on the payment of all moneys payable by the purchaser under these presents, and the observance and performance of the agreements and provisions on the part of the purchaser herein contained, and upon the surrender to the vendor of the purchaser's copy of this agreement, and any assignment or assignments thereof, (or in case same shall have been registered in the Land Registry Office upon satisfactory proof that same has been registered), the vendor shall convey or cause to be conveyed to the purchaser by a good and sufficient deed or deeds, in fee simple, all those pieces or parcels of land hereinbefore described, together with the appurtenances, thereto belonging or appertaining, freed and discharged from all encumbrances, except taxes from this date, but subject to the conditions and reservations in the original grant from the Crown; which

deed or deeds shall be prepared by Hugh M. Fraser & Co., Limited, of Vancouver, for the vendor at the expense of the purchaser, and the purchaser shall pay therefor the sum of \$5.00 for each deed. The purchaser shall be at liberty to occupy and enjoy the said premises as from the date of these presents, subject to impeachment for voluntary or permissive waste, until default be made in payment of any instalment of the purchase money, or the interest thereon, or any part thereof, on the days and times and in the manner aforesaid, or until the purchaser shall fail to comply with any of the conditions of this agreement casting an obligation upon the purchaser. And the purchaser doth hereby attorn and become tenant at will of the vendor from the said date of these presents at a rent equivalent to the amount of the instalments of the purchase money and interest payable on the days and times as hereinbefore mentioned, until the said purchase money herein mentioned shall be fully paid and satisfied. And the purchaser doth hereby declare that it shall be lawful for the vendor at any time after default shall have been made in any payment due hereunder to enter upon and take possession of the said premises or any part thereof in the name of the whole whereof the purchaser has attorned tenant, and to determine the tenancy created by the said attornment. And the purchaser doth hereby promise and agree that on default being made as aforesaid he will peaceably and quietly yield up possession of the said premises to the vendor freed and discharged from all claims by and from the purchaser under and by virtue of these presents, or any matter or things arising thereout.




