Dear Sir:

As requested by you in your letter of February 24th, we are enclosing herewith Custodian cheque for the sum of \$234.23. These funds represent all of the balance standing to your credit with this office with the exception of \$1.15 which we are holding in your account to cover the claim filed against you by the B.C. Railway Co.

We have written you at various times in regard to this claim of the B. C. Railway Co. but have received no reply. Unless we hear from you to the contrary we shall assume that this claim is correct and we will pay to the B. C. Railway Co. the sum of \$1.15 from your funds.

In your declaration to the Custodian, you stated that you owned no property in the protected area. However, the vessel "New Celtic", Vancouver 134438, which was registered in your name, was turned over to the Custodian by Naval Service in July, 1942. This vessel was sold for the total sum of \$400.00. Expenses in connection with this boat were \$72.32. The mortgage held by the Colonial Packers Ltd. was satisfied by payment of \$92.30 and the balance of \$235.38 was credited to your account.

No other property of any kind identified as yours has been reported to this office. It would appear that we have accounted for all of the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque we enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

With reference to your letter of the fourteenth instant enclosing a copy of a letter, dated the twelfth instant, to you from Mr. A. E. Russell, your Alberta Representative, we beg to advise you that according to our records Nobuo Yoshihara is a member of the Ucluelet Fishermen's Co-Operative Association. Shimataro Yoshihara's name does not appear on the list of members in our files.

With regard to Mr. Russell's statement that Nobuo Yoshihara should be credited with one-fifty-first (1/51st) of the proceeds of the sale of the boats owned by the Ucluelet Fishermen's Co-Operative Association, we would refer you to our letter of June 3rd in which we stated that a cheque in favour of the Ucluelet Fishermen's Co-Operative Association for \$18,223.53 covering the net sale price of the boat less the proportion payable to interned members of the Association was sent to Messrs. Norris & MacLennan on May 28th last. As the Association has controlled these funds, distribution, if any, will be made by the Association.

With regard to Mr. Nobuo Yoshihara obtaining funds from the Association, we would refer you to our letter of June 3rd, the third paragraph of which reads as follows:

"The members of the Co-Operative approved the sale of the fishing vessels "Loyal 1" and "Loyal 11" to the Canadian Govern-

This association was organized in October, 1941, for the purpose of taking over the assets of the Ucluelet Fishing Company Ltd., as the co-operative form was more suited to the needs of the members. The members of the co-operative association are the members of the Ucluelet Fishing Company Ltd., with the exception of two shareholders of the limited company who returned to Japan, and who were replaced. A list of the members of the co-operative association, who number fifty-one, is attached.

The members of the Co-operative approved the sale of the fishing vessels "Loyal I" and "Loyal II" to the Canadian Government on condition that the monies received would be kept in the control of the association, with the privilege of lending to members who needed monies up to the amount of \$480.00 each in proper cases.

The Custodian decided to make no objection to the execution of the Bills of Sale by the association and collection of the proceeds of the sale by the association, subject to the payment to the Custodian of 12/51's of the monies received, to cover the interests of interned members.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice is hereby given that a Special General Meeting of Ucluelet Fishermen's Co-Operative Association will be held at the Orange Hall, Lot 7, Block 14, District Lot 292, in the City of Slocan, in the Province of British Columbia, on Thursday, the 21st day of January, 1943, at the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of considering the following Resolutions which will be submitted as Extraordinary Resolutions for consideration, and if deemed advisable, that the same may be passed, with or without modifications:

1. That the Fish Packers, Loyal No. 1 and Loyal No. 2, belonging to Ucluelet Fishermen's Co-Operative Association be sold, assigned and transferred absolutely by the Association to the Department of Munitions and Supply of the Government of the Dominion of Canada, or such other Department of the said Government as may desire to purchase the same, at and for the price of \$10,900.00 for the said Loyal No. 1, and at and for the price of \$13,800.00 for the said Loyal No. 2, and that all Bills of Sale, Transfer Agreements and Assignments or other documents necessary or incidental for such purpose be executed by the Association by affixing the seal of the Association in the presence of the President and Vice-President, and that the same be adopted as the act and deed of the Association.
2. That the monies to be received from the sale of the Fish Packers, Loyal No. 1 and Loyal No. 2, as aforesaid, shall be paid as follows:
 - (a) To the Custodian of Enemy Property, 675 West Hastings Street, Vancouver, British Columbia, one fifty-first (1/51st) portion thereof for each and every member of the Association who is at the date of payment by the said Department of Government of the Dominion of Canada, interned under Regulations or Orders-in-Council of the Dominion of Canada respecting Trading with the Enemy and/or Alien Enemies, but not including those members who are not interned but are living outside protected areas pursuant to Regulations and Orders-in-Council of the Government of the Dominion of Canada respecting the evacuation of persons of Japanese origin from such protected or restricted areas;

(b) The balance of such monies shall be paid to the Association for its sole use and benefit to be used and applied by the Association as hereinafter resolved.

3. That the portion of the sale price of the Fish Packers, Loyal No. 1 and Loyal No. 2, to be received by the Association from such Department of Government of the Dominion of Canada, shall be deposited in a Chartered Bank of the Dominion of Canada in an account in the name of the Association.

4. That Kyuroku Shimizu, Masuke Hamada and Shinkichi Sakai, members of the Association, all presently of Slocan, in the Province of British Columbia, be, and they are hereby appointed a Committee to receive requests for loans or advances to members of the Association who are not interned as aforesaid, and if the majority of such Committee so determine and advise the signing officers in writing, then the signing officers of the Association be, and they are hereby authorized to pay monies of the Association to such member or members by way of loan up to the amount of, but not exceeding, \$480.00 to each such member, with or without security as the said Committee shall determine.

5. That in the event of any vacancy or vacancies occurring from time to time in the aforesaid Committee, the then remaining member or members of such Committee shall be at liberty to appoint another member or members of the Association (as the case may be) to maintain at all times a Committee of three members for the purposes aforesaid.

6. That any member of the Association who is not interned under any Regulation or Order-in-Council of the Government of Canada respecting Trading with the Enemy and/or Alien Enemies may request from the aforesaid Committee authority to borrow from the Association a sum of money up to but not exceeding \$480.00.

AND FOR THE PURPOSE of considering the following Resolutions which will be submitted as Ordinary Resolutions for consideration, and if deemed advisable, that the same may be passed with or without modifications:

1. That the signing officers of the Association shall be Tomise Yamanaka and Naotsugu Hakoda, and the usual Banking Resolution be passed in respect of such officers.

2. That J. Arthur MacLennan, of the Legal Firm of Messrs. Morris & MacLennan, 311 - 602 West Hastings Street, Vancouver, British Columbia, be appointed Solicitor of the Association for the ensuing year without remuneration, save and except his proper charges for legal services rendered on behalf of the Association.

3. That the acts and deeds of the Directors of this Association since the date of incorporation be ratified, confirmed and approved in every respect.

AND FOR THE PURPOSE of election of Officers, Directors and Auditors of the Association for the ensuing year, and any other matters of business which may be brought before the Meeting.

VOTING MAY BE IN PERSON OR BY PROXY IN
RESPECT ONLY OF ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Appointment of a proxy should be in writing in the form attached and to be valid must be deposited at the Registered Office of the Association not later than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the Meeting.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Shimetaro YOSHIHARA, Registration No. 05847

On April 19, 1942, this man signed a declaration to the Custodian in which he stated that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

The fishing vessel "New Celtic", Vancouver 134438, registered in the name of this man was among the vessels ~~turned~~^{turned} over to the Custodian by Naval Service. This vessel was sold by the Custodian for the sum of \$400.00. Expenses incurred with this vessel were \$72.32. Colonial Packers Ltd. held a mortgage under which there was due the sum of \$93.30. This mortgage was satisfied by the payment of the amount due on February 15, 1943. According to the boat file the mortgage duly discharged was received at this office on March 11, 1943. Neither the boat file nor file 6022 indicate what has happened to this discharge mortgage but we assume that it was attached to the bill of sale given to the purchaser of this boat. After payment of the mortgage of the boat expenses \$235.38 was credited to the account of YOSHIHARA.

It is noted that YOSHIHARA's file shows no evidence of any boat equipment. However, in the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee's records there is a memorandum on the file of the Officer-in-Charge, New Westminster, which requests that Mr. Robertson be supplied with the material belonging to the boat "New Celtic", which had recently been removed from the Celtic Cannery and taken to the Stores at New Westminster. There is nothing to indicate who Mr. Robertson may be or why the material was to be supplied to him. The memorandum is from A. Pilkey, surveyor for the Committee.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.
