The building at 250 Powell Street was owned by Kikuichi NAKAHAMA, File 11267, husband of Masaye, and son of Kikumatsu. The building was a one storey structure, with a store in the front resting on the ground. Behind and about four feet higher was a restaurant (2 rooms and kitchen) and behind that were two rooms (living quarters) and a woodshed, two toilets and a wash basin. The report of the agent handling the property dated August 12, 1942, stated that the whole premises were filled with rubbish and were in a filthy condition. On Sept. 5, 1942, Ker & Ker, the agents, had Mr. K. HAMA clean out the rubbish from the premises. On October 8, 1942, Ker & Ker rented the building to Mr. Jack Mar, but on Jan. 12, 1943, the agent notified us that Mr. Mar had not been allowed to move in by City Authorities due to the dilapidated state of the rear of the premises and the state of the water connections and wiring. It would seem, however, that Mr. Mar did occupy one room in the building and later other Chinese moved in. On the 5th of August, 1943, Eviction Notice was served on Mr. Mar and on September 10, 1943, the City of Vancouver was notified by this office that the building was vacant.

Upon examining all the files of this family, it is evident that Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA, File 1126, was the occupant of 250 Powell, as he so stated in his declaration to the Custodian, and he stated also that he operated a restaurant at this address. He declared that he had left in the restaurant chattels of a total value of \$2,959.00 and in the residence chattels to the value of \$760.00.

The files of Kikuichi NAKAHAMA and of Masaye NAKAHAMA (his wife) show that these persons gave their address as 263 Powell Street. Kikuichi NAKAHAMA is shown on the sheet of Information from RCMP to be a fish merchant. Report of C. Barrett-Lennard, dated June 13, 1942 (File 6042) states that a fish store was located at 253 Powell in a building owned by Komora Bros.

Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA and Masaye NAKAHAMA were evacuated on April 26, 1942, while Kikuichi NAKAHAMA left the protected area early in March, 1942. The earliest inventory of the goods at 250 Powell seems to be that made by H.D. Campbell on May 11, 1942, which appears on File 1126. This inventory shows that the two sewing machines were not on the premises at that time, lists fewer tables and chairs than were declared. On June 13/42, C. Barrett-Lennard made an inventory of the chattels, as shown by File 6042. This inventory lists numerous boxes, cartons and other containers (contents unknown) some of which Mr. Smith of this office stated were marked with the names of other Japanese. The goods from 250 Powell were removed to 992 Powell on July 7, 1942 under the name of Masaye NAKAHAMA. The inventory made at the time of removal is on File 6042, and shows considerably more goods than were inventoried by H.D. Campbell or Barrett-Lennard. Many of the additional items are not accounted for, and the possibility that the inventory of July 7, 1942, may have listed the same items twice should not be overlooked, as the goods declared to be at 250 Powell and inventoried there have been reasonably well accounted for, but the additional items reported removed have as stated been unaccounted for.

The goods removed from 250 Powell Street have been dealt with in the file of Masaye NAKAHAMA, and those that were sold were credited to her account. At the time the goods were removed a copy of the inventory was sent to Masaye NAKAHAMA and Kikumatsu

NAKAHAMA. This inventory was returned signed by "M. NAKAHAMA", with some additions. The entire inventory and additions were confirmed by "M. NAKAHAMA" as being all the property owned by her (the signature is that of Masaye NAKAHAMA) in the protected area. Notwithstanding this confirmation, Masaye NAKAHAMA had stated in her declaration to the Custodian that she lived at 253 Powell Street and she had declared chattels at 253 Powell that agree in most respects with the chattels found at 253 Powell, while the goods removed from 250 Powell appear to be those declared by Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA, File 1126.

In regard to the fish market at 253 Powell, an inventory of the chattels was made on May 12, 1942, by the COMTA, who stated that the landlord had said these were the property of "K. NAKAHAMA". This inventory agrees fairly well with the list of chattels supplied by Masaye NAKAHAMA in her declaration. The bicycle which she had declared was not on the inventory however, and there were a few other discrepancies.

The goods from 253 Powell Street were removed to 992 Powell Street, on May 25, 1942 and on October 8, 1942. The goods removed on May 25, 1942, were moved under the name of Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA. On September 11, 1942, a copy of the inventory of goods removed from 253 Powell was sent to Mrs. Masaye NAKAHAMA and to Mr. Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA, together with the copy of the inventory of goods from 250 Powell. This list was returned on September 11, 1942, with some additional items added, and bearing the signature of Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA.

On September 21, 1942, we again wrote Mrs. Masaye NAKAHAMA and Mr. Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA and called their attention to the fact that we had requested that they separate the articles mentioned on our lists in order to identify ownership. No reply appears to have been received to our letter. On December 17, 1942, we wrote Mrs. Masaye NAKAHAMA and sent her copies of the goods sold in her name. We informed her that we had been informed that goods belonging to S. Jikemura and Mr. & Mrs. Watada had been stored at 250 Powell, and we asked her to advise us which items had belonged to these people. Again there was no reply.

On September 16, 1947, a letter was received from Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA requesting that we remit to Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA, former 253 Powell, and to Masaye NAKAHAMA, former 250 Powell St., cheque and statement. It will be noted that the address given do not agree with the declarations of the two persons concerned, but since the goods removed from 253 Powell have been credited to Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA and those from 250 have been credited to Masaye NAKAHAMA, and since these are all members of the same family and are living together in Raymond, Alta., and they have not given us any assistance in straightening out the matter of ownership of the goods, we will leave the credits as they are, and will make remittances to Kikumatsu as if it were proven that his goods were those removed from 253 Powell and to Masaye as if it were proven that her goods were those removed from 250 Powell.

In regard to the other persons whose goods were stored at 250 Powell, we have transferred to the accounts of these others the proceeds of the sale of items that could be identified from the auction sheets. The Chattel Schedule shows what has been done.

The schedule shows that 3 boxes of goods were reported by Sakuzo JIKEMURA File 8948, to have been left by him at 250 Powell. The NAKAHAMA family did not reply to our letter requesting information about these goods. No goods identified as belonging to JIKEMURA were among those sold after removal from 250 Powell. According to his file, JIKEMURA stated on October 16, 1945 (apparently while in this office) that as far as he was concerned these goods had been abandoned and he had no interest in them.

The schedule shows that goods were stated to have been left by Matsuiro WATADA, File 9419, at 250 Powell. Early inventories show that an electric heater marked with his name was found. He also declared an oil lamp, toys, clothing and a kitchen cabinet. We are therefore transferring to his account the proceeds from the sale of an electric toaster, an Aladin Lamp, toys, clothing and a wooden cabinet, which had been removed from 250 Powell. The other goods which WATADA was said to have left in these premises could not be identified.

Asae KUMANO, File 11891 declared that she had left the goods listed at 250 Powell Street. All of her goods were shipped to her on May 23, 1942 (having been identified it would seem by her son) with the exception of 3 bundles of dolls. As there seems little doubt that at least some of the dolls credited to Masaye NAKAHAMA were the property of Mrs. KUMANO, the proceeds from the sale of some of these are being transferred to the file of Asae KUMANO.

Chomatsu KOYANAGI, File 4099 declared that he had left goods at 250 Powell. Most of these were sold and the proceeds have been credited to his account. One chair is not accounted for, and it has been assumed that the 3 iron beds discarded were his property. One bed and two springs are not accounted for.

Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA, File 1126: The goods declared by this man as being left at 250 Powell Street have not all been accounted for. Many were not found. Of those removed from the house and later shown to be missing there are the following:

The goods which Kikumatsu NAKAHAMA declared and which were found at 250 Powell and later sold have been sold in the name of Masaye NAKAHAMA and the proceeds are in her account. This condition apparently meets with the approval of the persons concerned.

Masaye NAKAHAMA, File 6042 declared goods at 253 Powell. The Schedule shows that some of these were not found. Some were but were not removed to storage or if removed were not sold or otherwise accounted for. Goods removed but not accounted for are as follows: 1 Show-case

1. Location and Nature of Property. One story frame house with store in front, located at 250 Powell Street, Vancouver, B.C.

2. Description of Land and Buildings. This is an old wooden building on a lot 25' by 122'. There is a store in front and five rooms behind. The rooms are connected with gas. There is no basement. Legal description (omitted in Form "JP") is Lot 23, Block 5, D.L. 196. I have not checked the title.

3. Inventory. I have taken an inventory of the furniture and effects belonging to the declarant and stored on the premises. I have numbered and tagged each item, and submit a schedule of the same, marked "Schedule A". I received the information regarding ownership of the inventory from Shokai BUNKA, tenant of the store on the premises.

4. Insurance. I have been unable to obtain particulars of insurance in force, as the declarant has been evacuated.
