In his declaration to the Custodian on April 18, 1942 this man reported that he owed \$0.00 to Brackman & Kar Milling Co. Brackman-Kar filed a claim for \$40.25 against this man. On April 14, 1945 OHAMA reported that this debt had been settled prior to his evacuation but Brackman-Kar wrote on April 17, 1945 this had not been settled. We advised creditor of OHAMA's address and are taking no further action in view of his claim it has been settled.

J. W. Kelly Piano Co. reported that a balance of \$52.60 was outstanding on a Victor Radio. On April 14, 1945 OHAMA reported that this had been settled by the return of the radio and surrender of contract. This was confirmed by J. W. Kelly Piano Co.

Matsuo YAMAKA filed a claim for \$14.00 against this man. This was referred to OHAMA who denied any knowledge of this claim and asked for further details. We wrote YAMAKA but received no reply and are therefore taking no further action.

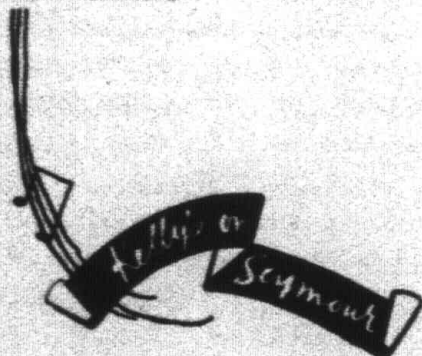
