PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Tadayuki MASAGO, Reg. No. 04194

This man, in his declaration to the Custodian, on April 20, 1942, declared no property of any kind in the protected area.

The Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada informed this office, however, that this man carried Life Policy No. 2294375, 20 year endowment for the sum of \$1,000.00; Beneficiary being his mother, Isono MASAGO. No premiums were paid through this office, and, after the release of this man from Internment Camp on August 14, 1943, the Custodian had no further interest in this policy.

Letter of April 13, 1942, reports a radio owned by T. Masago, of Steveston, stored with the J. W. Kelly Piano Co. Ltd, which the writer, R. O. Tufnail, wished to purchase. As this man was then in the protected area, and had not signed a declaration to the Custodian, this radio was not at that time under the control of this office. It is possible that he sold the radio to the prospective purchaser as the J. W. Kelly Piano Co. Ltd. did not report a radio owned by T. Masago among the radios in their storage.


