My information is that the above is the Wife of one Risaburo Taniwa about which latter you will have no information I fear as he left Chemsinus some three years ago having got into disgrace in relation to some quite young school girl in the Japanese Community. Mrs Naka Taniwa and family lived in House No 6 of Gihei Kawahara and as she never learned much English her son Iwao Taniwa has evidently assumed the position as head of the house and done such business as required. The other son Norimichi Taniwa got married and it would appear Iwao would have to keep and provide for the house.
