CHATELS:

The above, who made her declaration to the Custodian on April 27th, 1942, and was evacuated on September 8th, 1942, signed a yellow "No property" card stating that she had no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area in British Columbia.

The file reveals however, that she claimed chattels left at Cumberland, and evidence in the form of Custodian Release dated June 12th, 1942, shows that Mr. Matt Brown, our agent, effected shipment of these chattels to her on that date. A report on the son's file, Susumi UCHIDA, file 8020, from Mr. Matt Brown indicates that all the goods requested by Mrs. UCHIDA were shipped to her with the exception of 3 old beds, 1 old heater, 1 kitchen table and that these items were not of sufficient value to warrant the expense of shipping charges.

Net proceeds in the sum of \$67.37 have been received from Mr. A. G. Freeze, the Official Administrator, representing the proceeds from the estate of Yoshiro UCHIDA, son of the above, and this amount has been credited to the account of Mrs. UCHIDA as she was the sole beneficiary.

Please accept our thanks for your report on Mrs. Mino Uchida and her son, Susumi Uchida. We note that Susumi Uchida claimed ownership of house No. 5 built on property belonging to the Canadian Collieries "D" Ltd. We understand that this house is now vacant and boarded up.

In their declaration to us, Mrs. Uchida does not claim any personal effects, although we hold a receipt for articles which were shipped to her on June 12. We presume that these are the goods which were declared by her son.

We thank you for the list of articles which were left in the house, these being of very little value.

Further to our Administration Department's letter of October 21 on these files, we have checked the JP forms and your reports and find that after the things sent to Mrs. Uchida had been accounted for, the remainder left in the house checked very closely with the list attached to the first registration of Susumi UCHIDA of April 17. The only things that do not appear to be accounted for are the tools (specified in the second registration of May 7 of Susumi Uchida as two cross cut saws, one sledge hammer) and the clothing.

Under these circumstances, we are not quite sure what comment to make on the fact that this house was broken into or whether to refer this to the Japanese. Have you any record of what things were taken away and can you kindly in any case get us a brief report from the local police.

Dear Madam:

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that at the time of your registration with the Custodian you stated that you owned no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area in British Columbia. However, on June 12th, 1942, you applied to the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, for shipment of chattels which you had left at Cumberland. According to a report from our agent at Cumberland, these were all shipped to you with the exception of a few articles which he did not consider of sufficient value to ship.

We have received a cheque in the sum of \$67.37 from the Official Administrator. This amount represents the proceeds of the estate of your son, Yoshiro UCHIDA, as you were named his beneficiary. We now enclose our cheque in this amount. This represents your entire credit balance with this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.

MEMORANDUM

Files 6135, 8020, 11262 & 15185.

TO: Mr. F. G. Sears.

FROM: Mr. E. S. Bell.

March 6th, 1947.

Our records reveal a number of UCHIDAS but only one family of that name from the Cumberland area. This family consists of:

(1) Hise (Mrs. Kenichi) UCHIDA, Reg. No. 06131 (File 6135), a widow at time of her evacuation (Sept. 8/42).

She signed a Custodian "No Property" card and gave her address as Box 408, Cumberland.

(2) Yoshiro UCHIDA, Reg. No. 07355 (File 15185); This son of above widow died (Feb. 25/42) prior to evacuation date from this area. Proceeds of Life Insurance policy was paid direct to mother, the named beneficiary, by the Dominion of Canada General Insurance Company. Residue of Estate (\$67.37) was paid in to this office by Official Administrator, A. G. Fresse, for credit of mother, the sole heir.

(3) Susumi UCHIDA, Reg. No. 07337 (File 8020); This Canadian-born (May 16/17) son signed a Custodian "JP" form (May 7/42) and declared ownership of "House No. 188 Japanese Town No. 5" Cumberland, Canadian Collieries Ltd. being named owner of the land. He gave his address as Box 40, Coombs, B. C., where he was working as a Logger.

Since evacuation his address has been Bay Farms, Slocan, and he doubtless now classifies as a Farmer.

As declared owner of House No. 188 he was credited with the \$15.00 received from Canadian Collieries Ltd. as an ex gratia payment based on the salvage value to them of this building (which they otherwise required removed to make room for pending improvements).

(4) Minoru UCHIDA, Reg. No. 07336 (File 11262); This Canadian-born (Aug. 7/19) son worked as a Logger prior to evacuation and gave the same P. O. address as his brother. His mother signed a Custodian "JP" form (July 9/42) as his proxy, declaring neither real nor personal property beyond War Savings Certificates and a life insurance policy.

This evanee was re-admitted to Provincial Mental Hospital Apr. 28/42, and discharged on probation May 27/42, and appears to be with the rest of his family at Bay Farms, Slocan, at the present time.

George (15) and Tetsun (13), being minors, are carried in File 6/191.
