STATUTORY DECLARATION.

I, GILBERT SWAIN, of 254 E.Hastings St., Vancouver,  
British Columbia,

DO SOLEMNLY AND SINCERELY DECLARE AS FOLLOWS:-

1. That I am the rental department manager in the  
office of P.C.GIBBENS & CO., LTD, and have full  
knowledge of the facts herein deposed.
2. That prior to her evacuation, Mrs. Ijima rented  
the premises known as 334a, E.Cordova Street, at  
a monthly rental of Eight dollars.
3. That at the time of her evacuation, the said  
tenant was in arrears to the extent of slightly  
in excess of ~~two~~ <sup>two</sup> months rent, and we hereby submit  
our claim of two months rent amounting to ~~Sixteen~~  
dollars (\$16.00) <sup>24.00 - L.P.m.g.</sup> *Twenty-four* <sup>L.P.m.</sup> *g.S.*
4. That the said arrears of rent are now overdue  
and payable forthwith.

AND I make this solemn declaration, conscientiously

force and effect as if made under Oath and by virtue
