Mrs. Yuriko Shigematsu (file 6236) declared no personal property but on March 22nd this lady requested shipment of some effects left with Mr. Hiroshi Yoneda (file 4229), 147 Garry Street and subsequently moved to storage. Form 107 was sent to her instructing her how to apply for these things and shortly afterwards a Custodian Release was received from the husband, Sunao Shigematsu (file 4587). The husband had declared some articles left at Hiroshi Yoneda's house and an inventory #67 on his file under date of August 26th, 1942, records the removal to Storage of some belongings identified as his.

Shipment was made by Mr. Robinson against the above release but a bundle of bedside railings was either omitted or lost in transit and the following could not be found:

Wooden trunk
Box of silverware
Box of books

Reference to Hiroshi Yoneda's file 4229 shows that chattels left at his house and elsewhere were accounted for as per list dated November 26th, 1942, signed for by Mr. and Mrs. Hiroshi Yoneda on December 8th, 1942. These included "wooden trunks" and several boxes of glassware etc. Among them may be Sunao Shigematsu's things.

Additionally, Gunno Engemann declared considerable furniture-making machinery left in the store (River Garage?) rented from Mr. Torso Engman (file 12254). This was moved to storage February 22nd, 1943 (Inventory #409) under the name of Torso Engman. The undernoted items would appear to be Gunno Engemann's.

#17 Wood lathe
#18 Power saw with motor
#19 Band saw
#20 One box tools
Sundry unfinished furniture

In view of the fact that Torso Engman declared no personal property (all his valuable tools being hidden under the garage floor) it seems probable that ~~some~~ thing in list #409 is Gunno Engemann's and the quickest way will be to write Torso Engman and confirm he has no-thing left in the protected area.

I Wooden Trunk with linens, towels, and wedding outfit

I Dinner Set, serving 8, gold and wine trimmings, stored in a cardboard box.

NOTE: Please have these wrapped individually so as to prevent damage

I Electric Silver Coffee Set in cardboard box

I Electric Silver Waffle and Toaster

2 Boxes of Books

Please have the above goods shipped via C.P.R. to my address above. I will gladly pay for freight charge.

I would like to know what has become of the goods that was stored at Sun S. Furniture Store, in front of the Post Office, former tenant being Mr. Shimizu
