WHEREAS The Secretary of State of Canada acting in his capacity as Custodian under or by virtue of Order in Council No. P.C. 1665, dated the 4th day of March, 1942, as amended, may order that all or any property whatsoever situated in any protected area of British Columbia, belonging to any person of the Japanese race, may for the purpose of protecting the interest of the owner or any other person, be vested in the Custodian.

AND WHEREAS IWAKICHI KAKIUCHI is the registered owner of property described as Parcel "E" (D.D. 106633-I) of the Fractional North East Quarter of Section Twenty (20), Township One (1), Barclay District, and an undivided half interest in Parcel One (1), (D.D. 63267-I), of Block "B" of Section Twenty (20), Township One (1), Barclay District Plan Two Thousand Four Hundred and Eighty-six (2486), in the District of Victoria.

AND WHEREAS the above described property is situated in a protected area of British Columbia;

AND WHEREAS IWAKICHI KAKIUCHI, a person of the Japanese race, died on or about the 1st day of January, 1942, at Grappler Creek, in the Province of British Columbia;

AND WHEREAS Letters of Administration were granted by the Supreme Court of British Columbia, In Probate, on the 26th day of April 1945 to William Adolphus Ackland, Official Administrator for that part of the County of Nanaimo contained within that part of the Alberni-Nanaimo Electoral District lying North of Cameron Lake;

AND WHEREAS The Secretary of State of Canada acting in his capacity as Custodian has been informed that the said IWAKICHI KAKIUCHI Deceased, left him surviving Kikamo KAKIUCHI, Widow, (in Japan) and the following children: Iwakazu KAKIUCHI, son, Police Registration No. 00552 (interned); Noburo KAKIUCHI, son, Police Registration No. 03810, evacuated; Misayo MORI, daughter, (in Japan); Yoshiharu KAKIUCHI, son (in Japan); Yutaka KAKIUCHI, son (in Japan) and Teruyo KAKIUCHI, daughter (in Japan).

AND WHEREAS Japan is enemy territory or proscribed territory and the interests of Kikuno KAKIUCHI (widow), Misayo MORI (daughter) Yoshiharu KAKIUCHI (son), Yutaka KAKIUCHI (son) and Teruyo KAKIUCHI (daughter) in the property herein described are vested in The Custodian under or by Virtue of the Revised Regulations Respecting Trading With The Enemy (1943).

AND WHEREAS IWAKAZU KAKIUCHI was detained under the Defence of Canada Regulations on the 22nd day of May 1942 and therefore became an enemy within the meaning of the Revised Regulations Respecting Trading With The Enemy (1943) and his interest in the property herein described has vested in the Secretary of State acting in His Capacity as Custodian under or by virtue of the Revised Regulations Respecting Trading With The Enemy (1943).

AND WHEREAS Noburo KAKIUCHI, Police Registration No. 03810, a person of the Japanese race, was required to leave the protected area in the province of British Columbia by order of the Minister of Justice pursuant to the provisions of the Defence of Canada Regulations (Consolidation) 1941;

AND WHEREAS it appears that the interests of the said Kikuno KAKIUCHI, Iwakazu KAKIUCHI, Noburo KAKIUCHI, Misayo MORI, Yoshiharu KAKIUCHI, Yutaka KAKIUCHI and Teruyo KAKIUCHI in the said property should be vested in the Custodian;

Under date of the 23/3/1943 (Your 101, P. 53) you gave us the following information regarding the above man's family:

"The m/n was paraded and states that as far as he knows his father did not leave a will. He also states the full names of his mother and children and their ages are as follows:

Our records show that the father (Iwakichi KAKIUCHI, Reg. 03076, our File 14090) was found dead on 1/1/1942 (at Grappler Creek, Banfield, where he lived); that the mother (Kikuno KAKIUCHI, not registered, no File) and sister (Teruyo KAKIUCHI, not registered, no File) are in Japan; that we have no information as to the present whereabouts of the other 4 members of the family mentioned above, i.e.,

Dear Mr. Ackland:-

Information on our files reveals that Iwakichi KAKIUCHI died at Sanfield, B.C. on January 1st, 1942 and Ichitaro HARIYU is said to have died 13 years ago. Both are said to have died intestate.

Title to the property described as Parcel No. 1 (D.B. 63267-1) of Block B. of Section 20, Tp. 1, Barclay District, Plan 2486 is registered in the names of Iwakichi KAKIUCHI and Ichitaro HARIYU. This property is assessed at \$100.00 for the land and \$900.00 for improvements. Our file also shows 22 shares of Canadian Wic Company Limited, in the name of Iwakichi KAKIUCHI. The shareholders in this Company are all persons of the Japanese race and it is the intention of the Custodian to liquidate the assets of the Company in the future. Other than the above we know of no assets of either of the deceased.

MEMORANDUM

TO: MR. K. W. WRIGHT

FROM: MR. G. H. PEERS.

RE: Estate of Iwakichi KAKIUCHI and the  
U. S. "Loyalty K"

Iwakichi KAKIUCHI who died on January 1st, 1942, was the registered owner of the U. S. "Loyalty K".

He died intestate and from the list of his family it appears that there is 7/9 enemy interest, 1/9 Internee interest and 1/9 Evacuee interest.

The vessel was sold on April 15th, 1942, for \$1300.00 by the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee, and the net proceeds of \$1282.00 were paid to Iwakazu KAKIUCHI. The signature on the receipt is that of Iwakazu KAKIUCHI, P/W A-53, son of the deceased and was interned May 22nd, 1942.

It is not clear what happened to the proceeds of the sale of the boat and I am writing the Internee today for information.
