This file reveals that Zentaro HIGO owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

Zentaro HIGO, who registered with the Custodian on April 23/42 and was evacuated on June 3/42, signed a yellow "No property" card. However goods were shipped to him as shown on Chattel Schedule and summary on file, and other goods were found in his name and sold at auction for the net sum of \$71.83, and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian.

2 dinghies which he had left in care of Mr. Bicknell of the Vancouver Cannery were sold for the sum of \$8.00, and this sum credited to his account with this office.


We have still in storage (o had in Oct. 1945) one musical instrument, a koto, and some letters and photographs.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

Although Zentaro HIGO did not declare chattels left in the protected area, goods were removed from the Vancouver Cannery under his name. In his letter of December 10, 1946, he states that all the household goods removed under his name belong to his son, Yasuyuki HIGO, and he requested the proceeds from the sale be forwarded to his son.

Yasuyuki HIGO declared many items which were neither found nor auctioned in his name, and we can assume the goods tagged under the name of his father belong to him.

The piano mentioned on the father's Summary was declared by the son and it is still in the possession of Mr. Bicknell of the Vancouver Cannery. The son, Yasuyuki, now requests the Custodian to sell this piano. This will be followed up as soon as possible.

Zentaro HIGO, who registered with the Custodian on April 23/42, signed a yellow "No property" card stating that he owned no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area of B.C. Mrs. Zentaro HIGO, also signed a "No property" card. Nevertheless on Sept. 17/42 we received a letter from Mrs. HIGO asking for shipment of the following:

- 1 stove (tall square living room stove) - she states there are 2 stoves, but they just want the one sent.
- 2 boxes of chinaware & kitchen utensils
- 1 sewing machine
- 6 blinds & pair curtains (in ivory chest drawers)
- 1 gal. shoyu.
- 1 clock

The blinds were included in a shipment to the son, Yasuyuki, but all the other items asked for, with the exception of the clock, were shipped to Zentaro HIGO on Oct. 20/42.

We received a Custodian Release from Zentaro HIGO dated Nov. 2/42 asking for shipment of 1 wall clock and 1 new double bed and spring. These goods together with one box of effects and 2 saws, was shipped to Zentaro HIGO on Feb. 17/43.

Besides these goods shipped, chattels as listed on Chattel Schedule on file were inventoried in the name of Zentaro HIGO at the Vancouver Cannery warehouse on Dec. 17/42, Feb. 22/45 and June 11/45. Chattels as listed on Schedule were sold at auction for the net sum of \$71.83 and this sum credited to the account of Zentaro. The goods we inventoried in the name of Zentaro compare almost exactly with the goods declared by his son, Yasuyuki, as shown on the Schedule, copy of which is on both files. Of the goods declared by Yasuyuki, the only ones not found by the Custodian and either shipped, sold, or still in storage, on the file of Zentaro, are the following:

- 1 stove
- 1 treadle sewing machine
- 1 dining set consisting of buffet, table & 6 chairs
- 2 tables
- 3 linoleums and one inlaid linoleum.

Yasuyuki has claimed in his letter of March 29/46, that all the household goods, although tagged with his father's name, really belonged to him. We wrote to Zentaro HIGO on April 6/46, for confirmation of this claim, but have received no reply. *see letter Dec. 10/46 - file.*

Yasuyuki also claimed in his letter of Aug. 27/46 that there were fishing nets at the Vancouver Cannery tagged with the name of his father. No nets were declared by either father or son originally, none were found by the Custodian in either of their names, and Mr. Bicknell of this Cannery advised us by telephone on Sept. 7/46 that there were no nets in the Vancouver Cannery net house in the name of

Zentaro HIGO. Mr. Yasuyuki HIGO was advised of this in our letter of
Spt. 13/46.

We have still in storage at Steveston (acq'd in Oct. 1945) a musical
instrument, a koto, and some personal letters and photographs, in the name of
Zentaro HIGO. Shipment of the koto has been requested by the son.

Two dinghies which Zentaro had left with Mr. Bicknell of the Vancouver
Cannery were sold by Mr. Bicknell for the sum of \$8.00 and this sum remitted
to this office and credited to the account of Zentaro HIGO.

There is still a piano in storage at the Vancouver Cannery in the name
of Zentaro HIGO. Yasuyuki HIGO has written us about this piano and wants to know
approximately what it will cost to have it shipped to him at Barnwell, Alta. We
are advising him that as we do not know the weight of the piano we are not in a
position to give him an estimate and are suggesting that he contact the nearest
freight agent and get the agent to give him an idea of what it would cost.

We found a long narrow parcel at the home of FUKICHIMA (no further details) bearing the name Z. HIGO. When we wrote Zentaro HIGO asking him about this he said it was a Japanese musical instrument, a koto. The son, Yasuyuki declares a koto. It is in storage at Steveston, or was in Oct. 1945.

We have received a letter dated March 29th, 1946, from your son, Yasuyuki, in which he states that the household goods left at House #41, Vancouver Cannery, and at the Vancouver Cannery warehouse, although tagged with the name Zentaro HIGO, all belonged to him.

The proceeds from sale of goods found tagged with your name were credited to your account.

Will you please let us know if you agree that these goods belonged to your son, and that the proceeds should be transferred to his account.

It is noted that on April 23rd, 1942, you signed a card stating that you owned no property in any protected area of British Columbia, yet on November 2nd, 1942, you sent us a Custodian Release for a wall clock and double bed, which were shipped to you on February 17th, 1943. In addition, the B.C. Security Commission shipped five pieces of effects to you on October 20th, 1942.

In reply to your letters of the 26th ultimo, we would advise that the bureau, chiffoniers and china cabinet you ask about were found tagged with the name of your father, Zenaro HIGO, and the proceeds from their sale, along with other goods found in his name, have been credited to his account with this office.

You claimed in your letter of March 29th, 1946, that all the household goods belonged to you. We wrote to your father on April 6th, 1946, for confirmation of this claim, but received no reply from him. If this is the case, we must have a letter from your father stating that the goods do belong to you and requesting that proceeds from their sale be released to you.

In your second letter of the 26th ultimo you ask about the possible cost of having your piano shipped to you from the Vancouver Cannery. As we do not know the weight of the piano we cannot give you an estimate on the cost and would suggest that you contact your nearest freight agent and he will be able to give you a rough estimate of the cost.
