



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

RE: (Joe) Jukichi HAMAGUCHI, Reg.No. 04253

CHATELS: The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 23, 1942 and was evacuated on October 20th, 1942, declared no property of any kind whatsoever in the protected area. However our Steveston agent inventoried a net located at the Gulf of Georgia Cannery in the name of J. HAMAGUCHI. On Feb. 8/43 this spring net was sold for the sum of \$20.00 under Custodian No. 804, and this sum credited to the account of the above. As he had declared no nets we wrote to him on January 3, 1946 asking him to confirm ownership of this net. He replied on January 8th, 1946, to the effect that he owned no nets and that therefore this net must belong to someone else. The sum of \$20.00 has therefore been transferred to Net Suspense Account until the proper owner can be identified.

The file reveals that the above owned no specified articles.

MONEYS RECEIVABLE: The sum of \$4.51, being a refund from the B. C. Electric Railway Co. for security deposit for light, was credited to the account of the above. We wrote to him on April 14th, 1943, asking him if this refund did belong to him as the name given by the B.C. E.R. was just J. HAMAGUCHI". He replied on April 21, 1943, advising that this did not belong to him, but that it might belong to Judo HAMAGUCHI, File No. 12137. These funds have accordingly been transferred to that account.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.


