GENERAL SUMMARY

August 29, 1946.

Re: Masao MATSUI, Reg. No. 12182

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 24, 1942, in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind.

A 1939 Chevrolet truck, registered in this man's name but apparently belonging to his brother, File No. 5979, was released to the Pacific Co-operative Union and sold by that company. The net proceeds of \$670.24 were credited to the account of this man but later transferred to the account of his brother.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Standard Oil Co. filed a claim for \$8.00 against this man. MATSUI denied this claim and no further action was taken.

This file reveals no other liabilities of any kind.


