
Re: Gengo NISHIMURA - Reg. No. 10852

The above Japanese was beneficiary under his father-in-law's Insurance Policy, and upon his father-in-law's death, (Genichi NISHIMURA-File 5755) funeral and medical expenses were paid at his request, from the \$1000.00 deposited to his credit here by the Canadian Mutual Benefit Association, and the balance of \$632.00 was sent to him. A further remittance of \$8.04, from redemption of War Savings Certificates belonging to his father-in-law, was also sent to him.

No liabilities appear on this file, and the only funds accruing to Gengo NISHIMURA was a refund of \$1.76 from the B.C. Electric Railway Co.

This file needs no further administration and may now be closed.

Please find attached hereto cheque for \$632.00 being the balance of the settlement under the above mentioned death claim after paying funeral expenses of \$263.00, medical bill to Drs. Bigelow, Fowler and Poulsen for \$79.00 and legal fees amounting to \$26.00 to the firm of Locke, Lane, Guild, and Sheppard in connection with Succession Duty Releases.

On January 20th we wrote to the B. C. Security Commission and amongst other things sent to them for you to sign a receipt form to be returned here for the Canadian Mutual Benefit Association. Will you kindly send this receipt and return it without delay please.

In your letter of February 13th you write as follows: "When our Father died we sure spent plenty and all the expenses going to Calgary for cremation was paid by our friend". I take it that this means your personal expenses travelling to Calgary, but does not include the cost of cremation which was included in the amount of \$263.00 paid by the B. C. Security Commission to Christensen Brothers and which now you have reimbursed the Security Commission as above.

RE: Gengo NISHIMURA and Genhichi NISHIMURA (Dec'd)
Canadian Mutual Benefit Policy #B - 2774.

Attached please find Dominion and Provincial Succession Duty Discharges in connection with the above noted policy.

When the monies payable to Gengo NISHIMURA as beneficiary of this policy are received they should be credited to his account with the Custodian and the attached account to Locke, Lane, Guild and Sheppard amounting to \$26.00 should be paid as well as the B. C. Security Commission's recoverable invoice amounting to \$263.00 as authorized.

Another B. C. Security Commission recoverable invoice amounting to \$77.00 covering medical fees is on file, but the beneficiary of the policy has not authorized payment. It might be well to write the B. C. Security Commission at this time with a view to their obtaining an authority for the payment of this invoice.
