With reference to your letter of the 27th June, regarding the above Japanese, we wish to advise that Inokichi KOJIMA had a credit balance at this office of \$694.83, when he was deported to Japan on the 17th June, 1946. This sum was derived from sale of real and personal property, and after payment of his debts outstanding at that time, which amounted to \$81.27, the sum of \$613.56, was turned over to the Treasury Department, for transmission to KOJIMA in Japan.

There are, therefore, no funds available at this office for Mrs. Shigeno KOJIMA.

The above woman is the wife of the Isakichi KOJIMA #04067 who was deported by the Immigration Department some months ago.

In the meantime, she has taken up with a man by the name of Taro HILLI with whom she is living in common-law relationship in Toronto at the present time. She has four children with her and one other who is still living with Yoneyo URA with whom Isakichi was living in common-law relationship before his deportation.

Mrs. Kojima was in to the office to see me yesterday in regard to the sale of Mr. Kojima's house in Vancouver. She wonders if taking a full view of all the circumstances the Custodian would not be able to pass over to her the money received from the sale of Isakichi's property. While I have told her that her chance of receiving such would be extremely slight nevertheless, she wanted me to write you to find out what the actual situation is - - whether the property has been sold; if so, for how much and in view of the fact that she has to support four of the children, would it be possible to receive part or all of the proceeds of the sale of her husband's house.

May I trouble you to look into this matter and let me know the Custodian's reply?

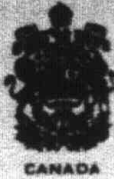

The above named died on December 13th at Ias no, B. C. He carried a B. C. Mutual Benefit Certificate in the amount of \$2,500.00, the beneficiary being his daughter Shigeno KOJIMA.

There is a claim on file amounting to \$92.40 made by Shintaro YAMASHITA against the deceased; and also a claim to be filed by the B. C. Security Commission covering funeral expenses incurred by the Commission in connection with the deceased.

We have on file authorization from the beneficiary to pay expenses in connection with obtaining succession duty releases and same to be paid from the proceeds of the Mutual Benefit certificate.

The B. C. Security Commission have obtained and are forwarding to the B. C. Mutual Benefit Association an order from the beneficiary to pay the proceeds of this certificate to the Custodian and also certified copy of death certificate and the membership certificate AS1994.

The deceased in his declaration to us of April 16th, 1942 stated that he had no assets with the exception of the above mentioned certificate.

If you see fit, will you please refer this matter to our solicitors in order to obtain the Dominion Government Succession Duty Releases. Please also see my letter to the B.C. Security Commission of Jan 24/45.
