



Dear Sir:

From time to time you have been advised in regard to the administration of your affairs and as this is now being completed it is felt you will appreciate being supplied with a brief summary.

The Custodian rented your property, 674 4th Avenue, Stevenson, to Mr. E. L. Lunley in July 1942 for \$10.00, which included \$2.00 for water rates. This tenancy was continued until the sale of the property and all adjustments were made on September 8, 1944.

On your Declaration of April 2, 1942, you declared stoves, beds, kitchen utensils and dishes. Your father, Inosuke FUKUSHIMA, also declared two beds and mattresses, nine chairs, kitchen stove and one heater stove which were left in your home. As your father was living with you at the time, we have assumed these articles all belong to you. You have received a copy of the Auction Sheet dated March 2, 1945 showing all the goods removed from your house by the Custodian had been sold and money credited to your account. In addition to the articles sold you owned one open carton containing clothing and owing to the various stages of disrepair we have discarded the old clothing as having no value.

As requested in your letter dated November 7, 1945, the Custodian purchased for you three \$10.00 and one \$500.00 Ninth Victory Loan Bearer Bonds. These Bonds are being held by the Custodian for safekeeping.

We are attaching herewith a statement of your account and it would appear that we have accounted for all the property of any kind declared by you in the protected area which was vested in the Custodian. In order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the amount of \$66.22 credited to your account and the Ninth Victory Loan Bearer Bonds being held in safekeeping, a stamped self-addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience in replying.

With reference to Mr. Mackenzie's memorandum of June 15th, 1944 on File 677, as the "JP" form on this file showed no proper inventory it is assumed that the articles signed for by the tenant, E. L. Lumley, are those only with which we are concerned. They are as follows and are taken from the forms dated May 21st, 1943:

On File 6426 the father of Fujitaro FUKUSHIMA declared that the following chattels were left at his son's house:

and presumably the above are included in the chattels signed for by the tenant.

We would add that a kitchen stove and Winnipeg lounge were removed to No. 2 Warehouse.

As this property has been sold you will no doubt wish to review these chattels.
