

Claimant is claiming for tools belonging to her husband UMANOSUKE SUZUKI, who is not making a separate claim for them, who carried on a business as a boat builder. Claimant did not declare these goods on her J.P. Form and did not mention in her claim that they were her husbands, she only declared her furniture left at No. 31 Imperial Cannery, for which she is not claiming.

Claimant's husband did not declare these goods until 12 January 1946. Claimant states that these goods were left in a nailed up cupboard at No. 27 Imperial Cannery, she locked up this house and took the key with her and did not hand it over to the Custodian.

(a) Goods value \$835.50 Declared not found.

(b) # 3.00 No record at any time. \$838.50

There is no record of any goods having been removed from No. 27 Imperial Cannery.

It is submitted that the claim of the claimant to the various items she is claiming is exorbitant. It is also submitted that she has no claim to them as the property does not belong to her and never did.

It is further submitted that concerning the goods declared on 12/1/46 the Custodian advised under date of 19/1/46 that he was not responsible and did not accept responsibility.

This boat house, which claiment stated they bought from a Japanese, was erected on land belonging to the Imperial Cannery. The Custodian wrote to claiment on 19/1/46 asking for a copy of the agreement giving permission to build on B.C. Packers property but no reply was received.

The manager of B.C. Packers stated that the Japanese were allowed to erect buildings on the Cannery land on the understanding that when they left the property the buildings became the property of the cammery. He wrote a letter on 21 May 1948 and stating that these buildings were the property of the Company.

It is submitted that the boat house claimed for is not the property of the claimant.
