The above, who made her declaration to the Custodian on April 28th, 1942, and was evacuated on October 20th, 1942, declared chattels as set on the Chattel Schedule, said to be stored at House #22, Imperial Cannery.

On August 16th, 1943, we wrote to the above and advised her that we were unable to locate any of her goods at House #22, Imperial Cannery, to which she replied on August 23, 1943, that she had changed her mind and had stored her effects in the barn on Chatham Street, owned by her husband. This building was used by us as our storage warehouse No. 6. As the effects of the above were already in the building, they were not inventoried by our Steveston agent. All the goods found here in the name of the above were sold at our Steveston auctions for the net amount of \$41.22, and this amount credited to her account. The balance of the goods declared but not found in the barn and sold, it must be assumed were taken by the above when evacuated on October 20th, 1942.

There is a Custodian release dated August 1, 1942 on file from the above asking for the shipment of one heater. As there is no further correspondence on this matter, we may assume the shipment was made.

Dear Madam:

Thank you for your letter of the 31st ultimo enquiring about your chattels.

Your file has been reviewed, and it is noted that when you made your declaration to the Custodian on April 28th, 1942, you declared chattels stored in the Imperial Cannery House. You did not state which Cannery house so we presume it was House No. 22 in which you had been living. We could find no chattels belonging to you in this house and advised you to this effect on August 16th, 1943. You then wrote to us and told us that you had stored all your effects in the barn house on the property belonging to your husband on Chatham Street. All the chattels which we found here tagged with your name were sold at auction for the net sum of \$41.22, and this amount has been credited to your account.

It is noted that on August 1st, 1942 you requested shipment of a heater stove. We presume you received this in due course as we have heard nothing further from you in this respect.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
