PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This man was evacuated on June 16th, 1942. He signed the Declaration to the Custodian on April 28th, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a trunk of clothing left in charge of the Police at Port Alberni. This was shipped to him on May 19th, 1942.

He stated that the Workmen's Compensation Board were paying him \$2.40 a day for an injury. This did not come under the control of this office.

He reported \$50.00 in Victory Bonds and \$115.00 in War Savings Certificates in the custody of N. Yamada, 325 Willingdon Avenue, Vancouver, to whom he owed a debt of \$150.00. The debt was not reported by N. Yamada and it would appear likely that Yumada has received the cash for these securities or that he has returned them to NAGAMI when the debt was paid. In any case property of this account did not vest in the Custodian.

The sum of \$4.00 was received from the Provincial Government as refund of One Percent Wage Deductions for the year 1941. These funds were credited to the account of SEI NAGAMI.

There may be a small sum coming to this man when the estate of his father Kanematsu NAGAMI, File No. 1066, is settled.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Re: Estate of Kameatsu HAGAMI, Deceased.

Replying to your letter of May 13, we thank you for your interpretation of the Administration Act in its application to shares payable to heirs of an intestate generally. We look, however, to the administrator of any particular estate to name the heirs and the amounts payable to each.

You may not understand that this office is concerned only with property which was left in the protected area of British Columbia and, at the death of the owner, in the shares from the estate payable to Japanese Evacuees and Enemies.

The deceased may own other property of which the Custodian is unaware and, therefore, in turning over property to an administrator we are only in a position to supply information relating to property under our control or of which we have heard and can give only the particulars of next-of-kin which have come to light through correspondence or which we have obtained from the R. C. M. P. records.

Since we do not often have reason to investigate property outside of our control or the existence of relatives who are not Evacuees, we merely pass on what is available on our file with no undertaking that the information is complete and final.

You state in your letter that "apparently the funeral arrangements and disposition of the effects were taken care of by a son, Sei Hagami." If you feel assured that this is the case and that Sei Hagami paid his father's funeral expenses, you might feel prepared to instruct this office to credit Sei Hagami's account with the proceeds from the estate in partial reimbursement for his advance for funeral charges and thus save the expense and difficulty of locating other heirs since the estate is so small. We will be pleased to hear from you in this connection.

As a general rule for your guidance, we wish to say that our usual practice when a death has been reported to us is to ask the next-of-kin to take steps to have the estate administered. When we are advised of the person in whose favour renunciation has been made, we forward all the information available on our file for their assistance. Later, upon receiving a certified copy of their appointment as administrator, we turn over the assets, including cash on hand. It is then our practice to require the administrator, before distribution is made to the heirs, to send us a statement of receipts and disbursements and a list of the heirs, with the amounts payable to each. We then advise the administrator whether it will be in order to pay the funds direct to the heirs or whether the funds should be paid into this office. Upon receipt of our recommendation, the administrator then requisitions the cheques from the British Columbia Finance Department in accordance with same. We have found this a very satisfactory procedure.

On reviewing the file of the above-mentioned Japanese, we find that he was accountant for the No. 2 District Fishermen's Association at Port Essington and had control over several accounts in the Royal Bank of Canada, Prince Rupert, and also had in his possession, in 1942, several hundred dollars worth of War Savings Certificates. The No. 2 District Fishermen's Association owns real property at Port Essington and it is possible that Nagami also had, in his possession, the Title Deeds.

This man's declaration also indicated that he had a wife in Japan whose name and address were stated by him to be as follows:

Kura Nagami,  
Hakahama Mura, Nishiku Gun,  
Tottori Ken, Japan.

We would be glad if you would let us know whether Nagami's effects disclosed anything concerning the above-mentioned assets and we would appreciate your sending us a copy of the inventory filed with the application for grant of Letters, together with a statement of receipts and disbursements for our file.

The balance of funds from the Estate, namely \$26.07, for the credit of Sei Nagami, are still held in this office as this man returned to Japan on August 2, 1946, before this money was passed on to him. In view of the possibility of there being other living heirs, please advise us what disposition should be made of this money.



We are enclosing herewith copies of correspondence received from Miss Kathleen Lang, Missionary to the Japanese, North Kamloops, B.C., together with her letter to us dated June 28th, 1945. Kindly undertake the administration of the late Mr. Nagami's Estate and, when Letters of Administration are granted to you, be good enough to forward Notarial Copy to this office.

We are also enclosing for your information a copy of the "Revised Regulations Respecting Trading With the Enemy (1943)" and we would refer you to Sections 21 and 35 regarding the vesting of enemy property in the Custodian and the payment to him of funds to which he is entitled.

Mr. Kanematsu NAGAMI, deceased, was a Naturalized Citizen of Canada but his son, Mr. Sei NAGAMI is a Japanese National. For this reason it will be necessary to forward to the Custodian any funds payable to the son, as well as to Beneficiaries resident in Japan.

We have a file in our office for the late Mr. NAGAMI but it does not record any assets owned by him. His liabilities, as far as we are aware, consist of a claim of M. Furuya and Company, Limited, for the sum of \$1.00. Messrs. P. S. Ross & Sons, Chartered Accountants, Royal Bank Building, Vancouver, are handling the affairs of that Company.

Dear Sir:

In early April of this year a Mr. Sei Nagami, working for the C.N.R. at Morey, B. C. (Via Red Pass) called on me and asked me to write a letter for him to the C.P.R. regarding the death of his father at Golden, B. C. Mr. Nagami's father was working for the C.P.R. and was killed in an accident at Glacier on Feb. 5th. Mr. Nagami the son, went to Golden for the funeral and was asked by the funeral parlor to pay the expenses which he did. He was now wishing to ask the C.P.R. for a refund of these funeral expenses and also for his father's wages to the date of the accident. Now Mr. Nagami's mother and sister were living in Japan so the C.P.R. sent a number of forms to be filled out and also said we must write the Workmen's Compensation Board.

A great many letters have been written on this matter but as Mr. Sei Nagami is at Morey, the C.P.R. and the Workmen's Compensation Boards in Vancouver I find it very difficult to handle. I am enclosing copies of letters sent and received and would ask you kindly to take over this matter if possible. As Mrs. Nagami is in Japan and as her husband was killed while on duty I do not see how the matter can be settled satisfactorily at the present time and suggested to the C.P.R. that it was a matter for the Custodian. The latest letter I have from the C.P.R. advises turning the matter over to an official Administrator. I went to the office of the Official Administrator here and he said it should be handled by the Commission.

I am sorry to have to trouble you in this matter but Mr. Nagami does not read English, is too far away to contact, and the problems brought up are very difficult for my slender Japanese vocabulary and my Japanese writing ability. I trust you will be able to help Mr. Nagami in this matter.

I thank you for your letter of April 12th. I regret the long delay in answering but this is due to the time taken in sending letters to Japanese as all such letters must be censored. I am enclosing P.R. 3 form signed by Mr. Nagami, son of the deceased. All these answers have had to be done through translation and are as far as it was possible for me to do so true translations of his answers. With regard to the last question Mr. Nagami says that he has no one that he can ask to sign such a bond as you require. As you say the wife of the deceased Mrs. Kanematsu Nagami is in Japan, so it is possible that the Custodian of Japanese goods might be able to give you further information as to Mr. Kanematsu Nagami's financial standing at the time of his death.

Your office at Revelstoke suggested that a birth certificate or some such paper verifying the fact of Mr. Sei Nagami's relationship to the deceased would be needed. Mr. Nagami has a paper from the Village Head man in Japan which gives both his father's and grandfather's name but I am sorry to say it is in Japanese. The R. C. M. P. would have examined this paper at the time of registration so could probably verify the matter of sonship without much trouble. However if you wish this paper forwarded to you I will do so on receipt of a letter from you.

It is my understanding that his son, Mr. S. Nagami, who took care of the funeral arrangements, will be reimbursed a certain definite amount by the Workmen's Compensation Board, to cover cost of funeral. I have, however, referred your letter to our District Claim Agent, Vancouver, who will get in touch with the Workmens' Compensation Board to see what has been done in the matter.

As regards outstanding cheques. Yes, there were two cheques, one for January 'B' period amount \$29.94, and one for February 'A' period amount \$5.18, and these will be turned over to whoever presents the necessary legal authority.

Dear Sir:

I am writing with respect to one Kanematsu Nagami who was working for the C.P.R. at Glacier but due to an accident at Glacier died at Golden Hospital on Feb. 5th, 1945. At the time of his death his son Mr. Sei Nagami, working for the C.N.R. at Morey-via Red Pass, B. C. went to Golden and took charge of the funeral arrangements. The son, Mr. S. Nagami has asked me to write to you. He is under the impression that the funeral expenses would be paid by the C.P.R. but Mr. Henderson from whose undertaking parlors the funeral took place asked the son to pay and he did so to the amount of \$125.00. Mr. Nagami also states that he thinks there is some wages owing to his father, covering the time from January 16th until the day of his death Feb. 5th. I should be glad to hear from you regarding these matters at your convenience.
