

Dear Sir

A few days ago, I wrote a letter to the Sun Life Assurance Co. in Vancouver, asking how we may get the Cash Surrender on our policies. I received the reply saying that if we received the money from the Assurance Co., the money must go through the Custodian before it is in our hands. So I would like to enquire if we received the money, would our children's maintenance be cut off? We are going to get the policy in cash surrender of our maintenance is still regular. We are going to have a new baby in our family, so naturally we must buy the baby all the necessity a baby needs. If we cannot get our regular maintenance if we get the cash from the Assurance Co., we must buy it with the money my husband makes. I bet is 22¢ a week and that is to support seven in the family plus a new baby in Oct. This winter, we must get each of us a new coat for the former one is the one since the evacuation. And you must understand that every clothe wears out. The children must be reclothed this winter and in doing so, we do not know where to get the money. For 22¢ a week is not enough to eat and to buy clothing. So please put this in mind. So please tell me how to go

about it

Now days my husband works at 22 1/2 of a hour. When he get his pay he get 1/3 of the way and the money left is counted like maintenance. If the maintenance is less, the Commission give us enough after my husband's pay. But if we get the cash surrenders, would it changed the maintenance?

Please do not think I am asking to get the Cash Surrender now because I do not want to get it till I get every thing straight. Please give me all the information so I will understand how to go about it
