Dear Sires-

In commention with the attached valuation report on a number of Japanese comed note now in your custody at Steveston, which I examined preterday, I would point out that my valuations seem to run extremely low compared to the prices set by the Japanese owners.

There are several factors which cause such a difference and one would be that the Japanese owner of most of the nets involved has placed very high prices on his nets. As an example, there is one case where his price was approximately the same as the present day new price for a similar net in spite of the fact that this Japanese would have purchased this net before present values were reached. In this case, also, his net has been used one or two seasons so that he has not provided for any depreciation. Another factor involved is that all of these nets have been lying around in storage conditions which may be considered harmful to the nets so that in addition to the ordinary depreciation which would occur when the nets are used, there is no doubt that there has been some further depreciation in storage.

I therefore feel that the valuations are quite reason-able and that no fisherman should be asked to pay more than these prices at this time.

It is my opinion also that as my valuations represent the retail value of these nets, if any canning company should wish to buy them they should be entitled to some sort of a dealer's discount, especially if they bought the whole lot. I would say, that this discount should be at least 10%, or possibly 15%, as these nets would have to be serviced at some expense and re sold to the fishermen. I make these qualifications in case it should be your policy to wish to get rid of these nets as quitiy as possible before further depreciation takes place.

He thank you for your letter of March 9th in answer to ours, which you state you received a few days ago. He do not know to which letter you refer as the last one on our file is dated July 17th, 1943 regarding an insurance policy. He did write to Mrs. Shisuke Marshallink on December 8th, 1944, regarding chattels. Would this be the letter to which you refer?

Answering the latter part of your letter we regret that we are unable to send you any money derived from the sule of constells until the position is clarified. Some of your goods were apparently listed with those of Mr. Toshic SAMADHIM and we are at present unable to identify which are yours. Next Mrs. Samue MATSUMURA on her J.P. form declares only a four place bedroom saits yet we moved from Genedian Pacific Cannery house no. 1, in her name, a long list of goods, of union we sent her a copy on December and 1942. These she confirmed on December 16th, 1944, and added to it a lot more items.

On your J.P. form you declared a sewing machine, a sofa, four bods, a table, a supposed, a chest of drawers, twolve chairs, and a box of kitchen utensils. The only items shown on the list of goods moved from Ganadian Pacific Canner; nouse No. 1 in your name are, one child's crib, one wooden box and spring, three iron bods and spring, and one sofa, of which only the last item has as yet been sold.
