The above, who made her declaration to the Custodian on April 27/42 and was evacuated on May 1/42, declared the following articles:

1 Machine for making noodles	1 Bed

These goods were stated to be left in the house of Yoshio NISHI, 26 Moncton Street, Steveston.

The chattels from this house were moved to the Japanese Church storage warehouse on October 29/42 by our Steveston agent, Mr. C.C. Robinson, and all were inventoried in the name of Yoshio NISHI, Int. File 1033, on Inventory List #75.

It is noted in a letter from Mr. Robinson to Mr. K. W. Wright, received in this office on Oct. 30/42 (on the file of NISHI), that this house at 26 Moncton St. was broken into and badly ransacked. It is noted that several other Japanese had their effects stored in this house and these goods were all included on Inventory List #75. Some goods, declared by the above, were found on this Inventory, and the proceeds from their sale in the sum of \$10.85, were credited to her account.

The file reveals the above owned no specified articles.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

The chattels were moved from this house on Oct 29/42 (all in the name of Y. Nishi) to the Japanese church storage warehouse.

A letter from C.C. Robinson to Mr. K.W. Wright received Oct 30/42 (on Nishi's file I. 1033) states that the house at 26 Moncton Street was broken into and badly ransacked.

It may be assumed that chattels of the above were included in list #75 on Nishi's file, and care should be taken in selling these goods to credit the above with her portion of the proceeds.


Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:
