Mr. C. P. Leckie Net and Twine Importer of Vancouver was here and I understand was authorized by the Custodian to value the Nets and Dog Fish Gear here belonging to Japanese. He valued all of the Dog Fish Gear at \$65.00 Sixty Five Dollars and one Net the property of K. Furigori at \$50.00 Fifty Dollars and one Net the property of S. Ozawa at \$30.00 Thirty Dollars, making a total of \$145.00 One Hundred and Forty Five Dollars.

We regret, however, that we never received your telegram and the writer clearly remembers this since we telegraphed two other Japanese from Rivers Inlet at the same time. We, therefore, arranged for a net appreiser to value your net.

Turning to the dog-fish gear, however, we regret that we have no further record of this. We did sell some dog-fish gear at the Beaver Cannery and the tags attached to this gear were sent to us by the caretaker. Your name did not appear on the tags.


