Certain goods were shipped to Mr. & Mrs. OKADA. Dishes and other small articles were sold at auction for the net sum of \$7.95, which has been credited to the account of Mrs. OKADA. Purniture sold for the net sum of \$17.17 was identified as the property of her husband, Ryoichi OKADA and the proceeds credited to his account. A baby carriage has been unaccounted for. Two cartons of personal effects are stored at 604 Cordova in the name of Ryoichi OKADA.
