
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

Re: Kiyoko (Mrs. Toshiro) TAMAKI, Reg. No. 08643

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 27, 1942. She was evacuated on July 25, 1942.

In her declaration she reported 8 pieces of effects left c/o Yu Quan Koo, Chemainus. The file of this woman's husband, File No. 11505, shows that these effects were shipped on his request with the possible exception of 2 beds, a mattress and a Samisen. On March 1, 1945, we wrote Mr. and Mrs. TAMAKI asking for the address of Mr. Koo or if these effects has been disposed of. We received no reply and nothing further has been done.

She reported a box of kitchen utensils left at the Japanese Community Hall, Chemainus. This box was shipped to her on May 23, 1942.

She reported twenty \$5.00 War Savings Certificates in her own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
