This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 27, 1942. She was evacuated on August 31, 1942.

In her declaration, Mrs. SEKO reported some chattels. Of these 6 boxes of kitchenware and a sewing machine were shipped to her. Toys and a trunk, apparently the box of dolls, #6, on her declaration were sold for the net sum of \$7.22. There is no record of the disposition of the bed, spring and baby bed. There may be a carton of personal effects (trusses) at 604 Cordova belonging to this woman.

Mrs. SEKO reported \$84.00 War Savings Certificates belonging to her husband. These were not brought under the control of this office.

Mrs. SEKO reported a Metropolitan Life Insurance Policy on her own life, and policies on the lives of each of her three children. These were not brought under the control of this office. She also reported her husband's Sun Life Assurance policy. This was not brought under the control of this office.

On February 11, 1947, the sum of \$4.75 was paid to this office by the Official Administrator who handled the estate of Kamezo MADOKORO, deceased father of Mrs. SEKO. This sum has been credited to her account.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
