PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

March 7, 1946.

Re: Isurutaro KAGETSU #06982

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 27, 1942.

On October 16, 1942, Mr. Matt Brown, Custodian agent at Cumberland sent us a report of articles on hand at that date. This list was sent to KAGETSU, who on November 16, 1942, confirmed that these were all the chattels remaining of his in the protected area. Some of the articles listed were shipped to him. Others were sold at auction by the Custodian on September 23, 1944, and the net proceeds from this sale, in the amount of \$103.27 was credited to his account. Two boxes and a basket, which Mr. Mills states contains some dolls (mostly broken) some rags and some dishes, are in 604 Cordova Street. Chattels unaccounted for are a box of chinaware (this may be included in the boxes in storage), a small tricycle, 2 mattresses (probably discarded), and the following articles which were left in the former residence of this man, an old range, an old kitchen cabinet, 2 old desks, 2 complete beds, 4 chairs and a kitchen table. The bench left in the house has been identified as the stand shipped to this man February 6, 1943, but this may not be correct. It is probable that Mr. Brown considered none of the articles left in the house of sufficient value to warrant the expense of removing. *Two boxes and one basket shipped March 26, 1946 JAC*

KAGETSU declared a share valued at \$2,000.00 in the Deep Bay logging Co. No funds have been paid in to his account from the liquidation of this company.

He declared 5 \$50.00 Victory Bonds, one \$100.00 Victory Bond and \$45.00 in War Savings Certificates. These were in his possession at the time of his declaration and did not come under the control of this office.

His bank account did not come under the control of this office.

He declared three Monarch Life policies and one Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association policy. One Monarch Life policy and the Yorkshire Savings & Loan policy were on the life of his 12 year old son, Susumu. On March 9, 1943, this office informed the Monarch Life Assurance Company that the values of policies of this man, his wife (this was the only asset declared by the wife and the only asset revealed by her file) and his son, Susumu, could be paid direct to the persons concerned. Insurance policies did not come under the control of this office.

The radio, which this man surrendered to the police, was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$29.65, which has been credited to his account. The receipt for this radio is on file.

A rural mail box, identified as the property of this man, was sold for the net sum of \$2.97, which has been credited to his account.

This file reveals no other property.

As you requested, we have shipped to you all goods, identified as your property, remaining in Custodian warehouse. The cost of shipping was \$3.70, made of of a \$2.00 charge for cartage and preparing for shipment and \$1.70 for freight to Shalalth. The shipment consisted of one box, one case and one basket. The cost of shipping was charged to your account with this office.

As you have already been informed, all saleable chattels left by you in the protected area, apart from those that have been shipped to you, were sold for the net sum of \$103.27, which was credited to your account.

The radio you surrendered was sold for the net sum of \$29.65, which was credited to your account.

The Victory Bonds, War Savings Certificates and bank account which you reported to the Custodian did not come under the control of this office.

Your life insurance policies did not come under the control of this office.

A rural mail box, identified as your property, was sold for \$2.97, which was credited to your account.

You declared a share in the Deep Bay Logging Co. So far, no funds have been paid in to your account with this office in connection with the liquidation of this company.

Altogether the sum of \$135.89 has been paid in to your account here. From this sum, we remitted to you \$100.00 on March 7, 1946, the sum of \$3.70 was paid to cover the cost of the shipment sent to you on March 26, 1946, and Custodian cheque for the balance of \$32.19 is enclosed herewith.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind, left by you in the protected area, which vested in the Custodian, and, in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

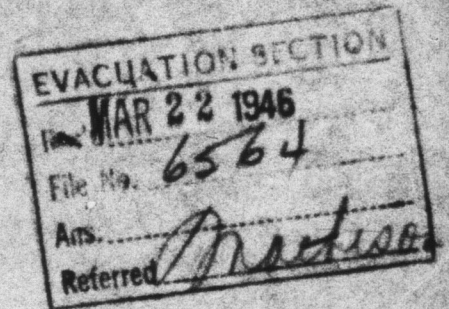

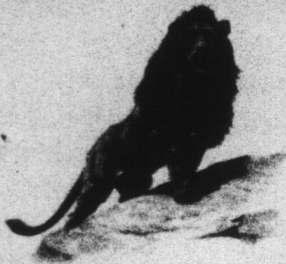
