This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 27, 1942. She was evacuated on August 21, 1942.

In her declaration she reported a large quantity of chattels in the name of her husband. Of these 2 boxes of kitchen utensils and 3 mattresses were shipped to her in May 24, 1942. Chattels, identified as her property were sold for the net sum of \$4.41, which was credited to her account. Chattels, identified as the property of her husband, File 5198, were sold for the net sum of \$24.46, which was credited to his account. A large quantity of effects are not accounted for, as shown in the Chattel Schedule and Summary.

This woman declared no other property and none is revealed by her file.

According to the file the fwo boxes left in the Community Hall and a mattreeses were shipped to Mrs. BIGASHI in May, 1942.

The following are unaccounted fors 2 bods, 4 tables, 1 cailing fixture, 1 baschall but, 1 gramphone, 5 chairs, 1 buffet, 1 bookense, 1 barral sance, 7 window blinds, 1 sleigh, lumber, stove pipes and gramphone records. The total value, according to Bre, BIGASHI's valuation, of the missing items is, approximately, include. It might be noted, however, that the valuations given by Bre, BIGASHI are considerably above the sales values as shown by the suction sheet on the items make. The storage batteries, for example, valued at \$10,00 would be unlikely to have any makes value in 1943 when sales of shettels were commenced.

These people, like many others, in Cheminus reported chattels left in the home of Gibel EAVAHARA. An inventory was taken of the EAVAHARA property, but it has not been pessible to reconcile the declarations of the various Japanese with the inventory, largely because many items were packed in boxes at the time of the inventory and these baxes were not opened. Items sold and credited to EAVAHARA might in some cases have been the property of these other Japanese, but as chattels of various householders are, on paper, similar it does not appear likely that we will be able to identify items at this late date. In the fall of 1963, items removed from the EAVAHARA houses as well as items stored in the Gommunity Hall were removed to Samains for sale. There is no evidence that an inventory was made at the time of the removal or at any time since. Chemainus chattels records are very incomplete.
