PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

August 20, 1946.

Re: Shinae RYUJIN #08531

This woman, in her declaration of April 23rd, 1942, reported a large quantity of household and personal effects left at House No. 12, Chemainus. This house was on the property of Gihei KAWAHARA, File 1746. Of the items reported as being in this house, a complete bed (with mattress) and a heater were shipped to her. A dining table, 6 chairs, quilts, bed-spread, cushion and paper, identified as her property, were sold at auction for the net sum of \$19.87, which was credited to her account. The remainder of the articles declared are unaccounted for. There is no inventory of these goods on file.

Mrs. RYUJIN reported four pieces of effects left in the Japanese Community Hall, Chemainus. All these were shipped to her.

She also declared a Singer sewing machine in the custody of Hideo SAKAMOTO, 2307 Oxford St., Vancouver, whose file, No. 11360, reveals nothing about this machine.

She declared no other property of any kind and the file reveals none.

CHATTEL SUMMARY

Re: Shinae RYUJIN #08531

This woman, in her declaration of April 23, 1942, reported a large quantity of household and personal effects left at House No. 12, owned by Gihei KAWAHARA, File 1746, Chemainus.

Of the articles reported as being left in House No. 12, a heater and a bed with mattress appear to have been shipped to Mrs. RYUJIN and her husband in response to their requests.

An extension table, 6 chairs, quilts, bedspread, boat cushion and paper, identified as the property of this woman, were sold at auction in Nanaimo.

No inventory was made of the contents of House No. 12. These Chemainus houses were broken into on a number of occasions. From information supplied by Mr. James, Custodian Agent at Nanaimo, who moved the chattels from Chemainus, and by Mr. Alfred Stubbs, who acted as Custodian Agent at Chemainus, and by the B. C. Police a large part of the chattels at Chemainus were of no saleable value, and a lot of these goods were discarded. No list of discarded goods was kept. It is not known, therefore, whether the goods, unaccounted for on this file, were stolen during break-ins, discarded as valueless or sold in the name of some other person. It is possible that some were sold in the name of some one else, as identification of goods at Nanaimo has been found to be unreliable. There is a list, supposedly an inventory of goods moved to Nanaimo in the name of Shinae RYUJIN's husband, but this list does not agree well with either the list of goods declared by Mrs. RYUJIN or the list of goods sold in her name. It is possible that funds may later be credited to her account from goods sold, which can be identified as her missing chattels.

Mrs. RYUJIN reported four items of goods left at the Japanese Community Hall. All these goods appear to have been shipped to her or to her husband.

When representatives of the Custodian visited these premises following the evacuation of the occupants of the house in 1942, no sewing machine of any kind was found and we understand that this machine was either taken away by yourself or otherwise disposed of prior to your evacuation.
