

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

June 6, 1946.

Re: Yaeno (Mrs. Torizo) YAMASHITA, Reg. No. 08772

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 27, 1942. She was evacuated on September 11, 1942.

In her declaration she reported 29 pieces of effects stored in her house at Chemainus. On August 21, 1942 she requested shipment of some of these pieces and on November 16, 1942 the husband of this woman File No. 11583, requested shipment of some of these pieces. Between November 22, 1943 and April 5, 1944 goods identified as the property of these people were sold at auction and the net proceeds credited to the account of this woman's husband. It would appear that about 15 pieces of the effects declared by this woman in her declaration are unaccounted for, as shown in the Chattel Schedule following.

She reported a box of kitchenware, china and crockery left at the Japanese Community Hall, Chemainus. This box was shipped on May 23, 1942.

She reported a Singer Sewing Machine held at the Singer Sewing Machine Co., Victory, with a balance owing on it of approximately \$54.00. On August 8, 1942 Mrs. YAMASHITA requested shipment of this machine and as the list sent to us by the Singer Sewing Machine Co. of September 22, 1942, does not show this machine on hand or a balance owing by Mrs. YAMASHITA, we assume this debt was paid by Mrs. YAMASHITA and the machine sent to her prior to that date.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Re: Mr. and Mrs. Torizo YAMASHITA

These Japanese lived in a house built on the Victoria Lumber Company's property and in which they have no longer any equity.

The wife declared personal effects and applied for shipments on May 16th and August 21st, 1942. The husband declared no personal effects but on November 16th, 1942, applied for shipment of all goods stored in the house.

Apparently everything was not shipped, some at least having previously been moved to the Community Hall for safekeeping -- see letter 5/11/43 on file 11583 at which time another shipment was made.

Some, presumably the remaining items, were sold at Nanaimo at auctions held there during late 1943 and early 1944. As we do not know what was shipped, it is impossible to say to what extent the wife's declaration is accounted for. There were most probably some thefts from this property which, with others, was situated in a small rather isolated group known as Chinatown. The houses were all slum properties and were later cleared away by the Victoria Lumber Company. As the value declared by the wife only totalled \$108.00, it seems that there was little loss suffered here.

The Singer Sewing Machine left at Victoria may have been either repossessed or paid for and shipped to the owner and this point can be raised when the proceeds of sale of chattels are communicated to these evacuees.
