

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This file reveals that Mrs. ASADA owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: Mrs. ASADA made her declaration to the Custodian on April 27/42 and was evacuated on Sept. 12/42. She declared chattels as shown on the Chattel Schedule on file at 532½ Powell St. This was apparently in error as she lived at 523½ Powell St. and in her letter of Nov. /42 she stated that all the personal property formerly declared by her at 523½ Powell St. had been disposed of prior to her evacuation.

She also advised us in this letter that she had left one wall clock in the care of Mr. Nils Engkvist, 523½ Powell St. This was confirmed by Mr. Engkvist on Oct. 27/42. No action was taken by the Custodian regarding this article. *not referred to in letter of July 31/47*

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: On Mar. 10/42 Mrs. ASADA surrendered the following radios and cameras to the R.C.M.P.:

Victor radio, Serial No. 9849, Model 122, Chassis No. 003250
Marconi Radi Serial No. 1041, Model 181
Westinghouse radio, Serial No. 119025, Model 154

Rollicord camera and case, Serial No. 776458
Zeiss-Ikon camera, Serial No. J24196
Universal Iris Candid camera and case.

The radios were sold at auction for the total net sum of \$70.59 and this sum credited to the account of Mrs. ASADA. However in her letter of June 25/46 Mrs. ASADA advised that the Victor radio belonged to Mr. Zenkei HUKAZAWA and the sum of \$25.60 was therefore transferred to the account of Mr. HUKAZAWA, representing the net proceeds from sale of the Victor radio. We have written to Mrs. ASADA several times regarding the ownership of the other two radios but she has not replied to our letters. We are therefore transferring the net proceeds from their sale to Chattel Suspense Account until the ownership is determined.

In her letter of June 25/46 Mrs. ASADA stated that the Zeiss Ikon and the Rollicord cameras also belonged to Mr. HUKAZAWA. The Rollicord camera is missing, apparently stolen from our warehouse. The Zeiss-Ikon was mailed to Mr. HUKAZAWA, File 12220, on July 15/46. We have written a memo to Mr. Wills asking about the whereabouts of the Universal Iris camera.

WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATES: Mrs. ASADA declared two \$5.00 War Savings Certificates in her own possession. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian

This woman surrendered to the RCMP three radios and three cameras. Of these the following were the property of Zenkei HUKAZAWA, File 12220, according to information received from both HUKAZAWA and Mrs. ASADA. See letter of June 25, 1946, from Mrs. ASADA:

Victor Radio, Serial No. 9849, Model 122, Chassis 003250
Rollicord Camera and Case, Serial #776458, Triotar, F.3.5 Lens
Zeiss-Ikon Camera, Serial #J24196, F4.5, Model 515.

The funds from the sale of the Victor Radio were transferred from the account of Mrs. ASADA to that of Zenkei HUKAZAWA on July 4, 1946. The Zeiss-Ikon camera was returned to HUKAZAWA in July, 1946. The Rollicord camera is missing.

Mrs. ASADA claims ownership of the other two radios and the camera, which were surrendered by her. These have been dealt with as follows:

Marconi Radio, Serial #1041, Model 181, appraised for insurance purposes at \$15.00, was sold on January 27, 1944, for the total sum of \$30.00.

Westinghouse Mantel Radio, Serial #119025, Model 54, appraised for insurance purposes at \$10.00, was sold on January 27, 1944, for the total sum of \$23.00.

The net proceeds of the sale of the two radios was \$44.99, which has been credited to the account of Mrs. ASADA.

Universal Iris Candid Camera and Case, no serial number shown in record. This was appraised for insurance purposes at \$7.50. This camera is in the office at this time, and will be shipped to Mrs. ASADA today.

The above-indicated woman turned in to the R.C.M.P. three radios and three cameras. These were listed under RCMP #398. The radios have been sold and the proceeds credited to Mrs. Asada's account.

Letter from Miss Kimiko SAITO, Reg. 00106, File 12645, would indicate that these articles were not the property of Mrs. Asado solely, but that some other person was the owner of certain of the radios and cameras in question.

Miss Saito's letter indicates that the owners wish, if possible, to have their cameras returned to them. Would you, therefore, hold the three cameras listed under RCMP #398, until the owners have had an opportunity to arrange for shipment.

These cameras were released to the Custodian in January, along with the radios, which were sold by auction January 27, 1944.

Dear Sir:

I would like you to advise me about the cameras and radios which are now in your hands.

I was told to inquire with the R.C.M.P. which I did but last week they wrote me back stating that all radios and cameras were handed over to you and that I should write directly to you concerning this matter.

I have been asked by two different parties about their belongings which they left with the R.C.M.P. when they left the protected area. (We have their receipt).

The first party is in Vernon, but he left them together with the lady's who is now in Slocan. (All were registered under Mrs. Asada.)

What the first party would like to know is, is it possible to have it in his possession in Vernon? If this is impossible, he would like his friend in Ontario to have his radios and cameras.

The lady too would like his son in Ontario to have them since it is impossible to have it in her possession in Slocan.

Please advise me at your earliest convenience, the best and right way to obtain them.
