WHEREAS by order of the Minister of Justice dated February 26th, 1942, every person of the Japanese race having in his possession or upon his premises any article mentioned in Section 2 of the said Order including any motor vehicle, was required forthwith to cause such articles to be delivered up to any of the authorized persons named therein;

AND WHEREAS certain persons of the Japanese race instead of delivering their motor vehicles as required by the said Order to the authorized persons named therein caused such motor vehicles to be delivered to the Pacific Co-operative Union upon certain terms and conditions as agreed mutually between such persons and the Pacific Co-operative Union;

AND WHEREAS it appears that the said Pacific Co-operative Union obtained from the said persons of the Japanese race transfer forms covering the registrations of such motor vehicles and subsequently title to such vehicles was transferred to the Pacific Co-operative Union;

AND WHEREAS the Chairman of the British Columbia Security Commission on direct order to the president of the Pacific Co-operative Union required the Pacific Co-operative Union to deliver such motor vehicles to the persons authorized to receive same at Hastings Park in the City of Vancouver on the eighteenth day of March, 1942, and such motor vehicles were forthwith delivered in accordance with the order of the said chairman;

AND WHEREAS a ruling was obtained from the Minister of Justice as to the effect of such transfers and it appears that the Custodian should release from his control the said motor vehicles enumerated in the attached schedule in accordance with the power given to him under Regulation 39 of the Consolidated Regulations Respecting Trading with the Enemy (1939);

NOW THEREFORE the Secretary of State of Canada acting in his capacity as Custodian by his duly authorized Deputy GLENN WILLOUGHBY McPHERSON hereby releases and relinquishes any property, right, title or interest where legal or equitable or otherwise howsoever which the Custodian had or may now have in and to the said motor vehicles enumerated in the attached schedule, such schedule being identified by the signature of his said Deputy GLENN WILLOUGHBY McPHERSON.

To make sure, I am writing to the Custodian to inform them that your account has been paid."

The long delay in answering your letter was due to my absence from home for a month, as I was called away to Alberta to attend a sick brother.

I hope and trust that with the informations furnished, the matter will be settled to the mutual satisfaction.

We acknowledge your letter of the 9th instant and it is almost impossible for us, at this time, to obtain verification or otherwise of what Ichisuke Kariatsumari says regarding these accounts.

It seems to us that the only thing to do in this case is to regard the accounts as due and payable and hold any monies there may be in your Trust Account ear-marked for these Companies, pending any adjustment there may be with the West Coast Trading Company, Limited.

As we have informed you previously, all three Companies are closely inter-twined and the members were evacuated before all accounts were adjusted. However, many of the members of the West Coast Trading Company, Ltd. are under the impression that they could give back their shares to the Company and receive cancellation of their debts with the Farmers' Products Distributing Co. Ltd., and the B.C. Purchasers' Co-op. Assoc. This cannot be done because a Limited Company cannot traffic in its own shares, but, as we have previously pointed out, in connection with these Companies, there were share transfer arrangements, among the 3, to adjust matters to a certain extent. Just to what extent this was accomplished, before the evacuation, it is now impossible to say and this cannot be arrived at until representatives of all Companies are brought together, with their records and share certificates, some of which we have in this office and some of which are in the hands of the officers.

As it is important that we obtain verification or otherwise of what KARIATSUMARI says regarding these accounts, we shall be obliged if you will co-operate to that end and in due course let us have your reply.

Our files in connection with this particular truck apparently require some assistance from you, in order that we may have a clear picture as to the treatment accorded the truck in question by the Pacific Co-Operative Union.

On November 1st Mr. Ichisuke Kariatsumari, who at that time was in East Lillooet, stated that insofar as his truck, Serial No. 8915856, was concerned, he had received word from you to the effect that the truck in question had been sold for \$700.00 and that said \$700.00 would be forwarded by the Pacific Co-Operative Union to the Custodian. We wrote you in this connection in November 9th and, not having received a reply, wrote you again in this connection on November 23rd. We now feel that probably due to pressure of affairs in Mission you have not been able to deal with this question.

We find in the report of August 31st prepared by Messrs. Riddell, Stead, Graham & Hutchison that this particular truck is described as being purchased by a Mr. J. Horsting, and the same report indicates that the agreed upon sales price was \$400.00 against which collection of \$407.00 had been received.

In other words there appear to be several contradictions, and we ask that you be good enough to give this matter your early attention, clearing up the apparent

contradictions, providing us with a clear statement and
providing us also with a cheque in the total amount due
in respect of this car, the cheque to be made payable to
the order of the Custodian of Enemy Property.



