

This 38-year old Housewife, a Japanese National, from Cumberland, signed a Custodian "JP" declaration form on the 28th April, 1942.

Her husband, Denjiro (File 6869) signed a Custodian "No Property" card on the 28th April, 1942.

They were evacuated together on September 8th, 1942, presumably with their 3 children.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: None, but Evacuee declared ownership of a dwelling built on land ed by Canadian Collieries Ltd. who took over all such buildings on their land, making an ex gratia payment for estimated salvage value to them of the materials therein. In this case this amounted to \$20.00 which was credited to this account on August 21st, 1943.

Chattels: See Chattels Schedule for particulars of Chattels.

pecified Articles: None.

Bills Receivable: None.

Bonds, Shares, etc.: None.

Bank Accounts: None.

Liabilities: There are no claims recorded in this file but there is a claim of \$4.61 filed by M. Ebisuzaki & Company against her husband, Denjiro (File 6869).

Dear Madam: -

The Custodian is pleased to inform you that arrangements have now been completed whereby Canadian Collieries (Dunsmuir) Limited, have taken over numerous houses on their properties that were at one time occupied by persons of the Japanese race.

As the company owned the land, the right to use and occupy such buildings was contingent upon payment of a nominal rent. We are informed that the right of occupation and use of any structure on the land was to terminate if the occupier ceased to be an employee of the Company. The Corporation, however, agreed to pay an estimated salvage value for the buildings, and pursuant to the agreement, the Company's Inspection Engineer, along with our Agent, appraised each building on the basis of its value to the Company, in connection with their building plan.

You occupied the building known as House #20, To. 1 Japanese Town and the award fixed as aforesaid amounted to #20.00. Your account has, therefore, been credited with this sum.
