

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian April 28, 1942. He was evacuated from the protected area on September 12, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a sewing machine, a trunk and two boxes. These were shipped in June and July, 1942.

On November 17, 1942 he reported a quantity of other chattels. Of these, there is no record of the handsaw, records, gas lamp, Cushions or Crock. The other articles reported appear to be inventoried, under slightly different listing, by Mr. Matt Brown in his report of January 14, 1943. None of the items reported in this letter of November 17, 42 have been sold, and it is probable that these were shipped to him as he requested.

In report of January 14, 1943, Mr. Brown reported some additional items, which at that time were in the former residence of ASAO or were in Cumberland storage. Of these items an oil burner unit, a bed & spring, chest of drawers, kitchen cabinet, 4 chairs and a bamboo rack and unspecified number of medicine cabinets (the rack and cabinets had not been mentioned previously) were sold at auction for the net sum of \$12.40, which was credited to the account of Sedaki ASAO.

This man surrendered motor-vehicle listed as V-13, which was sold for the net sum of \$320.88. This sum of money was credited to his account.

This man reported a 4-room house on land belonging to Canadian Collieries (Dunsmuir Ltd.). His account was credited with the sum of \$30.00 received from the land-owner in payment of estimated salvage value of this building. The right of occupation and use of the building ceased, under terms of agreement with company, when the occupier ceased to be an employee of the company, therefore ASAO had no legal equity in the building.

Victory Bond, \$50.00 and \$24.00 in War Savings Certificates reported did not come under the control of this office.

File reveals no other property.

The credit balance of \$363.28 in your account with this office, of which you were informed by Custodian representative at Slocan, is made up from the following credits:

The saleable chattels, identified as your property, remaining after shipments had been made to you, were sold at auction for the net sum of \$12.40. This sum was credited to your account.

As we informed you on January 21, 1943, the Dodge Sedan registered in your name was sold for the net sum of \$320.88, which was placed to your credit.

The sum of \$30.00 received, as you were informed on August 26, 1943, from the Canadian Collieries (Dunsmuir) Ltd. as the estimated salvage value of the house you had built on land belonging to that company was credited to your account.

The Victory Bond and War Savings Certificates which you reported in your declaration to the Custodian did not come under the control of this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

Dear Sir:-

In making declaration of your property to the Custodian, you claimed to be the owner of a house built by you on land owned by the Canadian Collieries Limited at Cumberland, B.C. We have been informed by the Canadian Collieries that you were permitted to build upon this land and occupy the premises only while you remained an employee of the Company, and that the building is now the property of the Company.

While we desire to protect your ownership of the house, we shall have to accept the statement of the Company unless you can submit some evidence of your right to retain ownership of the house. I suggest that, to this end, you give me information on the following questions:

1. When you built this house did you get a lease of the land from the Company; or did you belong to an association which was granted a lease of a larger area of land of which the land on which your house is situated is a part, and, if so, can you give me the name and address of the party holding this lease? Any lease of the land occupied should be sent to me for inspection.

2. Have you any letter or other document from the Company giving you the right to occupy the land, and if so, please send such letter or document to me.

3. Did you occupy this land only by verbal permission of the Company?

4. Are you supposed to pay rent to the Company, and do you propose to continue paying it?

5. Was there any understanding between you and the Company that the house should become the property of the Company if and when you quit working for the Company?

If you still consider yourself owner of this house it is important that you should write me at once giving such information as you may be able in substantiation of your claim.



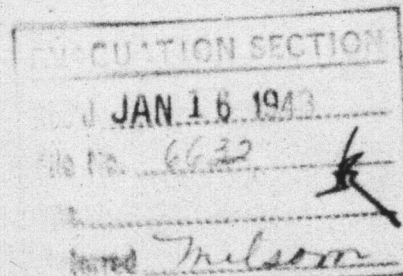

As the Company owned the land, the right to use and occupy such buildings was contingent upon payment of a nominal rent. We are informed that the right of occupation and use of any structure on the land was to terminate if the occupier ceased to be an employee of the Company. The Corporation, however, agreed to pay an estimated salvage value for the buildings, and pursuant to the agreement, the Company's Inspection Engineer, along with our agent, appraised each building on the basis of its value to the Company, in connection with their building plan.

You occupied the building known as House #63, No. 1 Japanese Town, and the award fixed as aforesaid amounted to \$30.00. Your account has, therefore, been credited with this sum.
