



The above Japanese made his declaration to the Custodian on April 28th, 1942 and was evacuated on July 27th, 1942.

Sikizo NAGAI did not declare any personal property but our fieldmen discovered a few effects left in care of H. T. Barnett, Mission. These were recovered and sold at Mission auction of December 13th, 1944 realizing the net sum of \$4.35 which was placed to his credit.



You declared that you had no personal property in the Restricted Area but we were advised by Mr. H. T. Barnett of Mission, B.C. that a few effects belonging to you were left in his care. These were recovered in accordance with Government regulations and sold at Auction for the sum of \$4.35. 
