Your letter of January 18/44 file #6708 addressed to my wife MATSUO HAYASHI registration #13321, with an enclosure of a cheque for \$1.60 for refund of 10% wage deduction, is rather a peculiar one, for she did not earn any wage while she was in B.C. Could it be a mix up with a refund to my brother MITSUO HAYASHI registration #13331, or it might even be a money coming to me from my c/c with you. I am holding the cheque pending your reply.

Incidentally, will you please send me a complete statement of c/c with you.

I was advised by you on August 1943 that certain property of mine was sold to the Soldiers Settlement Board as of January 1, 1943, but no price was mentioned
