

Replying to your letter of the 8th instant we wish to advise that your late husband's share of the distribution of the River Fish Company Limited amounting to \$46.77 has been transferred to your account.

When you returned to Japan however, you received from the Government of Canada, an advance of \$200.00 which has since been reduced to \$196.62 by the transfer from your late husband's account of \$3.38. All monies received for your account must be applied on your indebtedness to the Canadian Government before anything can be paid to you or anyone else, and the amount of the above mentioned distribution is being transferred to the Canadian Government.
