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


A list of chattels was declared by Mrs. Yoshimi Takahashi in her JP form as having been left at 414 West 6th Avenue, Vancouver, B. C. This list, however, was superseded by that enclosed by Mr. Yoshimi Takahashi with his letter dated November 18, 1942, at which time he stated that some of the goods declared by Mrs. Yoshimi Takahashi had been disposed of. Chattels have therefore been dealt with on the husband's file, number 12621.

On January 3, 1944 goods were moved from 414 W. 6th Avenue and sold at Vancouver Auction No. 9 on January 20, 1944. Additional goods were sold at Vancouver auctions 10 and 37 held on February 9th, 1944 and December 14, 1945, respectively. The proceeds from the sale of all chattels removed from the above address were credited to Yoshimi Takahashi's account, although it was later revealed that a brother, Yoshinaga Takahashi, had left chattels at this address.

Mrs. Yoshinaga Takahashi declared in her JP form dated June 8, 1942 goods as having been left at 414 W. 6th Avenue and in a letter dated April 14, 1946, the husband, Yoshinaga Takahashi, listed on behalf of his wife the chattels left at these premises and asked for information regarding them. On April 20, 1946, Mr. Spain advised Yoshinaga that due to lack of identification marks all goods were removed and sold under Yoshimi Takahashi's name and the funds credited to Yoshimi's account. He stated, however, that at Yoshimi's request we would forward the auction sheets that they might get together and examine them and separate the articles. No reply was received to our letter and Yoshimi Takahashi was repatriated to Japan on August 2nd, 1946, leaving the matter of chattels unsettled.

The proceeds from the sale of chattels in the amount of \$321.27 are being held in Yoshimi Takahashi's account pending correct distribution.

Although no answer has been received to the Protection Department's letter of December 9th to the tenant about the stove that was thrown away, I consider this matter need not be carried further as the Takahashis have similarly not commented on letter of December 31st giving them further particulars of the matter.

This leaves the items locked up in one room at this address, which were originally declared by the wife. This declaration may now be ignored as the husband writes on November 18th that after registration some furniture was sold. With this letter he encloses a complete list of the effects still remaining and this list, which seems to comprise mainly of tools and gardening implements, should be taken as the correct one.

Dear Sir and Madam:

On receipt of Mr. Takahashi's letter of November 18th, we got in touch with the tenant of your house at 414 West 6th and took up with him the question of your kitchen range. He claims that your wife told him that the range was very old; when he offered to buy it your wife said it was valueless and that a junkman had refused to make an offer for it. Under these circumstances, the tenant felt justified in giving the stove away especially as there were holes in the fire box. No stove pipes could be found.

We think it is clear from this that the value of the range was so small that we need not take any further steps about it.

We note the list of furniture and effects stored by you in the locked room at your house as enclosed with your letter of November 18th and thank you for sending this to us.

Dear Madam:

On September 21st Messrs. Macaulay, Nicolls,  
Maitland & Co., Ltd. advised us that you had removed Mr.  
& Mrs. Takahashi's range to the back garden and later gave  
it away as it was very old.

We wrote to the Japanese and he advises us as  
follows:

"In fact the kitchen range was  
old, but my wife left the range  
with stovepipes in the kitchen  
and she told the tenant to store  
them in the basement for her,  
and the tenant agreed. The tenant  
had therefore no right to sell or  
give it away."

We understand from our investigator's report that  
you did, in fact, move the stove into the backyard in order  
to install your own stove and that you permitted someone,  
unknown to you, to come and take it away for some people who  
had no stove.

We must advise you that, on evacuation, all Japanese  
property vests in the Custodian and that you had no right what-  
soever to dispose of this article without referring to us. If  
it was incommoding you, a telephone call to us would have been  
sufficient to have it promptly removed to safe storage.

MEMO - To Mr. Spain

Would you please refer to our letter of September 17th on file 12621 herewith, Messrs. Macaulay, Nicolls, Maitland & Company's letter of September 21st, ours of November 5th to the above two Japanese and finally, their answer herewith of November 18th.

I would like a first-hand report on the question of the kitchen range. It probably was of little value but should certainly not have been given away without reference to this office and it might be worth considering claiming on the tenants.

The contents of the locked room are another of those matters that may remain in abeyance for the time being and I am sending an extra copy of this memorandum in order that you may keep it as a reminder for the time when you can get around to an inventory.
