Referring to our letter to you of the 7th instant, and reply by Mrs. ARAKAWA of the 8th instant, we wish to request an answer to ours of the 7th instant. In our letter of that date, we made it clear that your wife's account had been charged in error with \$88.98. Dear Sir:-
