PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

On April 28, 1942, this woman signed a declaration to the Custodian stating that she owned no property of any kind in the protected area. She was evacuated on May 4, 1942.

Her husband, File 878, in his declaration of March 29, 1942, had listed a large quantity of household effects. On November 17, 1942, this office informed him that when his former residence, 207 Vernon Drive, Vancouver, had been investigated this property could not be found, and that it was reported to Custodian representative that he had sold or otherwise disposed of it before evacuation. No reply was received from him. The first letter received from either of these people was Mrs. MADOKORO's letter of October 5, 1945, stating that her effects had been sold to Mrs. Bond (c/o Norris Confectionery, 2280 East 45 Street, Vancouver) with whom these had been left, and that Mrs. MADOKORO had received the sum of \$90.00 from Mrs. Bond. Information had previously been received in this office that Mrs. Bond was holding chattels belonging to Mrs. MADOKORO.

No other personal property of any kind is revealed by this file.
